## ALTAR GUILD

We have ladies and men who take care of the Lord's Altar. We have five regular meetings during the year in January, March, April, September and October.

We meet on the last Tuesday of the month at 6:30pm in the church basement. Twice a year members receive a six month schedule which shows when they are scheduled to work.

Those on the General Duty Schedule, serve with three to six fellow members for that weekend and serve approximately once every six weeks. When scheduled, someone would work Saturday to dust the altar and get the communion ready for that weekend's services. Then others would work after the 8:00 am, 10:30 am and 6:00 pm service to wash up and refill for the next service.

We have a Linen Committee who wash and take care of the Altar and Communion linens, wash and press pastors and acolytes robes, and change the Paraments (colors) on the Altar, Lectern and Pulpit for each church season.

The Candle Committee checks to make sure there is enough oil in the cartridges for regular services, funerals and weddings Also the communion candles and the baptismal candle.

# DORCAS SOCIETY

The Trinity Dorcas Society was formed about 50 years ago by a group of women looking for fellowship with other Christian women, Bible study and an opportunity to serve the Lord. An evening meeting time was chosen so that women who worked outside the home could attend. The group chose its name from the story of Dorcas found in Acts 9:36–42. The Bible says she "was always doing good and helping the poor."

Our projects are supported by donations from our members and profits from our Card Nook and bake sales we hold at various times of the year.

We serve Trinity Church by making donations to our Open Hearts Food Pantry and providing tuition assistance for students attending Trinity School. We sponsor one of the soup luncheons during Lent. We donate a flower or plant to help decorate our church at Easter and then give it to a shut in from our congregation. We also maintain the Card Nook in our church basement.

The Dorcas Society shares the love of Jesus in our community by donating food baskets at Thanksgiving, providing Christmas gifts for a needy family, and making annual donations to the Christmas Spirit Appeal, HAVEN, Pine Crest and the Food for Kids programs along with occasional donations elsewhere.

The Dorcas Society is a member of the LWML (Lutheran Women's Missionary League). Our members place their loose change in MITES boxes which is then donated to missions throughout the world.

We begin our meetings with devotions. We then have a Bible study and a business meeting followed by fellowship time.

### ELDERS

Each week participants have the opportunity to watch a video featuring internationally known grief support professionals. Then the group has a discussion about that week's topic. Each person also uses a workbook to do daily lessons at home.

GriefShare seminars are offered at Trinity twice a year. The current seminar began in September and will end at the beginning of December. The Spring seminar will begin in early March. Meetings are held in the church basement every Monday from 6:00 to 8:00 pm.

The announcer introduces listeners to the worship service by reading an opening announcement and then making periodic announcements, such as the hymn to be sung, and finally a closing announcement at the end of the service.

### THANKSGIVING

### DINNER

Local churches have provided a Thanksgiving Day dinner to the Merrill community for over 33 years and it is Trinity's turn to host this year. This yearly event serves close to 300 people in our community each Thanksgiving. We need your help in donating your time and food donations. This year the meal will be carry-outs and delivered only from the Enrichment Center from 10:00 am until 12:00 pm. Meals will be sent out cold so individuals can warm them up when they want to eat.

The Free Summer Lunch for Kids and Teens program has come to a close for 2023. This is the program that was launched in 2013 by Christ United Methodist Church to help address the need for a midday meal for kids in the Merrill area during the summer weeks when school was not in session. In 2014 other churches in the community joined in and the program expanded to cover each weekday during the summer weeks of June, July and August. The program operates for 12 weeks each summer.

This program is sponsored by volunteers from Our Saviour's Lutheran Church, St. Stephen's UCC, Christ UMC, Trinity Lutheran Church and St. John Lutheran Church. Last year there were 4875 bag lunches served to the youth of the community. That exceeded any amount the program has ever done in the past. But this year, the same five churches served 7,153 meals!! Over the ten years of operation, the program has adapted to various changes that have come up. Most notably, since COVID-19 happened more than 3 years ago, the meals became brown bag lunches that could be picked up and taken home for the children to eat.

Once again, the Merrill Community Food Pantry partnered with this program and provided some of the staple items for the lunches such as the juice, the snack item and fruit. Without the help that the Merrill Community Food Pantry provides, the churches would find it very difficult to continue to provide complete meals to the children and teens.

This year the program also received a very generous donation from Habitat for Humanity. In addition, the Merrill Lions Club and Merrill United Way provided financial donations. This support helped make it possible for the churches involved to provide the meals. The T.B. Scott Free Library also partnered with the lunch program. They gave away books to youth as they stopped in to pick up their meals.

The Free Summer Lunch for Kids and Teens would like to extend a very big Thank You to all who were involved in making this program a huge success this summer. This program could not serve the children and youth of the Merrill community without the continued participation of the volunteers from the churches involved as well as the very generous contributions of community partners like the Food Pantry and area businesses. We look forward to being able to serve the needs of the local kids again next summer.

### TRINITY COUNTERS

The Money Counters meet every Monday morning at 8:00 a.m. We separate the offering envelopes from loose cash and coins. Loose cash and coins are recorded on the Plate Offering Sheet.

Next, we separate the offering envelopes into packs according to the envelope number (100s, 200s, 300s, etc.) Each pack is then arranged in numerical order.

Every envelope is cut open with a manual or an electronic opener. Then we record cash, coins, and checks from each pack on a separate sheet.

A Total Contribution Sheet is used to record totals of each pack in the appropriate columns. Cash, coins, and checks are counted and totals for each are checked to see they match with the totals on the Total Contribution Sheet.

### TRINITY MERRILL LUTHERAN SCHOOL

We are excited about our learning environment, which prepares students with the skills they will need in the future. Each day, teachers and learners work together, learning through a combination of text and experiences. of the classroom. We have active, competitive sports teams (volleyball, soccer, and basketball), and a phy ed curriculum promoting life sports. Music and art instruction are a part of each child's experience, and all students participate in monthly Family Service Groups. Students have leadership opportunities in the student leadership team, student-led weekly chapel, and National Junior Honor Society.

We know that learning is easier when you have an excellent teacher. That's why our educators are lifelong learners and passionate about the subjects they teach. Each teacher is state licensed and most are LCMS called. Teachers range in experience from five to 40+ years as educators. Our support staff of aides, administrative assistant, cooks and custodians overflow with love and the same passion for excellence.

### TRINITY QUILTERS

Simply said, the Quilters make quilts of all sizes. The majority of these quilts are donated to the Orphan Grain Train charity and sent anywhere in the world ....wherever there is a need.

The Quilters meet Mondays from mid September through June from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. (with holiday breaks, of course) in the lower level of the church. This is where we tie the quilts. Several members take the quilts home, hem them and return them. They are packed in bags. When there are enough bags to fill a carload, they are taken by one of our members to St. Mark's, Wausau. Here Orphan Grain Train volunteers sort the quilts and repack them. They are then shipped to Westfield and out into the world.

Some members sew quilt tops at home. The tops are brought to church and made into quilts. Fabric they use may come from their "stash". We also have donated fabric which we use to sew the tops. Donations of cotton quilting fabric are always appreciated.

Most of the quilts are tied with yarn which is also donated. Members also make afghans, lap quilts and scarves from the yarn. These are also donated to the Orphan Grain Train.

Thanks to Thrivent, we have used their dollars to purchase polyester batting which is used as "filler" in the middle of the quilts. This is easier to work with, to tie and makes the quilts totally washable. Thank you Thrivent!!

The quilt backing is usually donated sheets. Again, thank you for these donations.

We have an annual Quilt Show on Mother's Day weekend in May. Quilts are available for purchase, and over the past five years we have been able to donate over \$3,000 to both Trinity and Orphan Grain Train! The quilts which remain after the Show are also donated to Orphan Grain Train. Typically two carloads and over 100 quilts are taken to St. Mark's!!

### CAFE

Serving coffee and donuts attracts members, encourages bonding and stimulates growth.

CAFE volunteers welcome worshippers by serving coffee, orange juice, milk and donuts before and after the 8:00 AM and 10:30 AM worship services.

CAFE volunteers arrive 30-45 minutes prior to a worship service to brew the coffee and set out the donuts, milk and orange juice, which will be at church for you.

You can choose the service times that work best for you. Based on the amount of volunteers, you are scheduled every other month.
