Advent 2025 Series: “Do Not Be Afraid”

Week 1 — November 30, 2025

Zechariah: Fear of the Future — Luke 1:5–25

When the future feels uncertain or out of reach, God’s promises still come to birth in us and among us.

Week 2 — December 7, 2025

Mary: Fear of the Unknown — Luke 1:26–38

Prayer Shawl Sunday & Crockpots + Caroling

This Sunday will be filled with beauty and community. If you have received a prayer shawl, we invite you to wear it in worship as a symbol of God’s comfort and the compassion of this congregation. Then return Sunday afternoon for Crockpots & Caroling — one of the most joyful nights of our year. After the 11:10 service, we will host a celebration of Austin’s ministry. Please join us as we express our gratitude and celebrate his work among us.

Week 3 — December 14, 2025

Cantata Sunday — “The Promise of Peace”

This intergenerational worship service will bring together our adult, youth, and children’s choirs to proclaim peace through music. It is also “Invite-a-Friend Sunday” — a wonderful chance to welcome someone into the hope and wonder of Advent. There will be no sermon this week; the music is the proclamation.

Joseph: Fear of Judgment — Matthew 1:18–25

True peace begins when we choose trust over fear and compassion over judgment.

The Session of Brownson met on Monday, November 17. The devotional was delivered by Elder Ryan Morrison using Psalm 136:1 "Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; His love endures forever."

Endowment Realignment - David Wood, Chair of Stewardship Ministry put a previous vote up for its required second vote for the endowment realignment proposal. The proposal involves transferring \$300,000 from the Main Endowment to the designated Personnel Endowment to better manage the expected and beyond our control increased personnel expenses related to higher healthcare costs as dictated by the PC (USA) Board of Pensions. After discussion, the proposal was approved by Session vote.

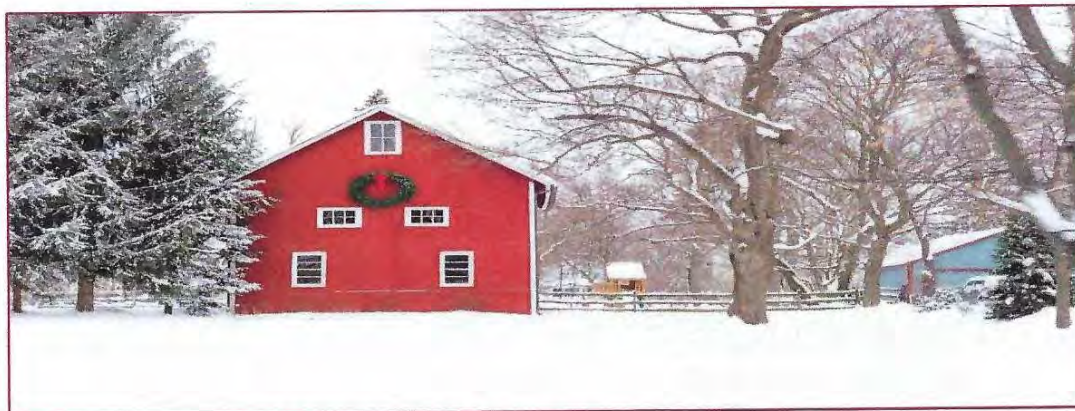

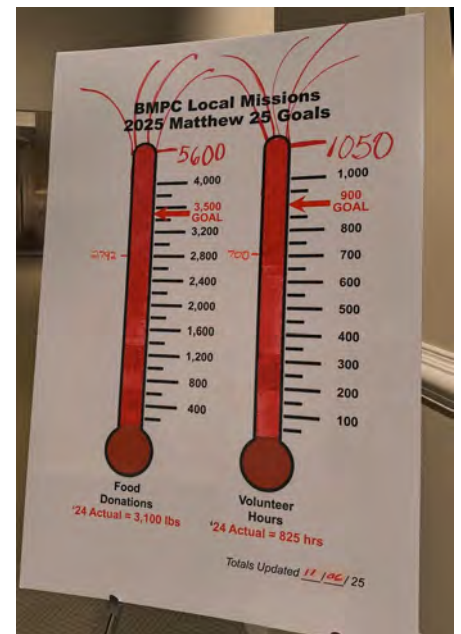

Buenos Dias desde la Escuela para Sordos L'Eppe en Nueva Cajamarca Peru (Good day from the L'Eppe School for the Deaf in Nueva Cajamarca, Peru).

As the 2025 school year winds down in the coming weeks for summer break, the L'Eppe School for the Deaf is already looking ahead to a new school year beginning in March. The three-room schoolhouse will continue serving K–12 students and will once again offer lessons for family members. Jessy Chavez, the school's longtime primary teacher, is especially excited to train several of her former students as formal teaching aides, expanding opportunities for deaf children to learn sign language and access basic education.

In August, eight Brownson members visited the school to help complete the third classroom and install a concrete pathway from the road to the schoolhouse—an important improvement that keeps shoes and feet dry and mud-free during the rainy season. Most importantly, our team spent much of its time learning sign language, assisting with arts and crafts, playing games, and sharing fellowship with the students and their families. At every step, the words from Hebrews felt especially fitting: “And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another.” (Hebrews 10:25)

Our 2026 Peru mission trip to the L'Eppe School—named for the 19th-century Frenchman credited with creating modern sign language—is scheduled for July 25 through August 2, with optional excursions to Cusco and Machu Picchu afterward.

APPALACHIA SERVICE PROJECT



Since 1969, Appalachia Service Project has made homes warmer, safer, and drier for families while providing transformational service experiences for volunteers. Each year, more than 15,000 volunteers serve with ASP, providing critical repairs for over 350 families.

In the few months since our summer '25 ASP trip, volunteer groups from Jonesville have continued working on Mrs. Doris's and Mr. Ronald's homes in Wise County, VA. You may remember that at Doris's house, our team installed new vinyl siding, added insulation under the house, repaired a major plumbing issue, and installed underpinning. Since then, volunteers have added a new porch and a much-needed wheelchair ramp, and have continued improving the livability of the inside of the home.

At Ronald's home, our team completed an internal "hug"—adding insulation, new drywall and trim, and making flooring repairs to help keep the main part of the historic home warm for winter. Volunteers have since continued this work and have installed new floor coverings throughout the main floor.

In 2024, our team learned about Mr. Billy, a veteran in Wise County living without a working bathroom due to severe septic issues. ASP was unable to address the problem at the time for two reasons: permits required a functioning septic system, and the cost of replacing the system exceeded available funds. The good news is that work has begun this year, and we are hopeful that the bathroom and kitchen will soon have working plumbing.

None of this would be possible without the generous support of our congregation. Together, we have raised more than \$32,000 for critical home repairs in Wise County—the community our mission teams served in both 2024 and 2025. These funds have been specifically designated for repairs in the region, which is among the poorest in Virginia, and have directly supported projects at the homes of Doris, Ronald, and Billy.

We are already looking forward to our 2026 ASP mission trip. No construction experience is required—will you join us? We're seeking volunteers from middle school through adults. Look for more information in the coming months.

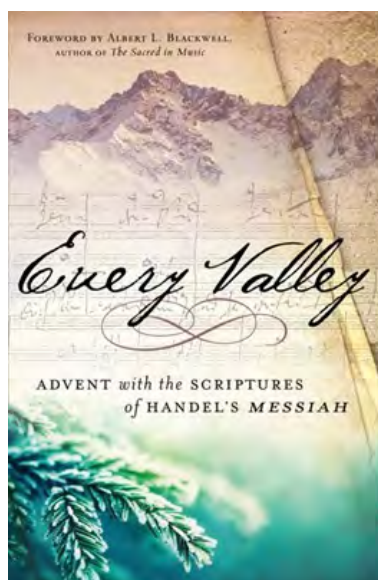

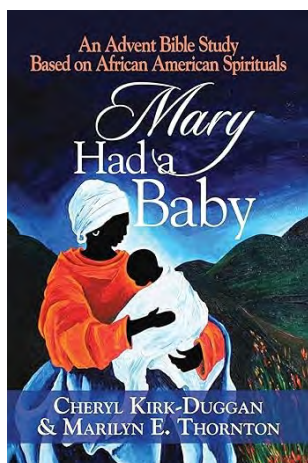


Every Valley

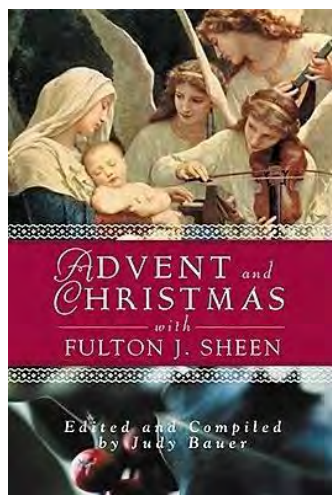


Mary Had a Baby

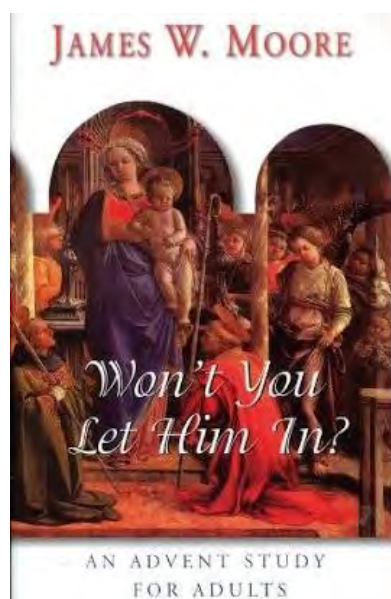


***Advent and Christmas* With Fulton J. Sheen**

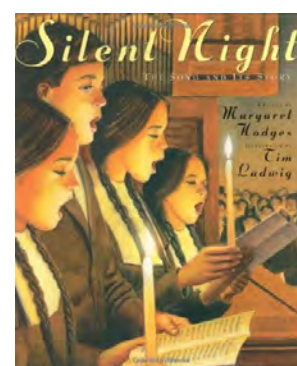


Won't You Let Him In?
