Dear Brownson Church Family,

Listen.

It is one of the most important spiritual practices.

On Monday, I received multiple calls, texts, and heartfelt conversations about food insecurity in our community. After prayerfully listening, it became clear that the Holy Spirit was nudging us to act.

We call ourselves a *missional church*—a people both *called* and *sent* by God. In that spirit, we hear Christ's words in Matthew 25 ringing in our ears:

"I was hungry, and you gave me something to eat."

Normally, I would have worked this through our usual processes, but this moment feels like a Spirit-led opportunity to respond quickly and faithfully. So, I ask for your forgiveness, your blessing, and your partnership as we take these steps together.

This Sunday is **Commitment Sunday**, a day when we bring our pledges to God as an act of worship. This year, we're also asking every household to bring **canned goods or nonperishable food items** to worship—signs of our shared commitment to feed the hungry.

During both services at **9:00** and **11:10** AM, you'll be invited to bring your pledge cards and food donations forward to the Communion Table. Together, we will fill the space around that table with visible reminders of God's abundance and our call to serve others in Christ's name.

This Sunday will be a beautiful expression of who we are—a community that listens for God's voice and reaches beyond our walls to share Christ's love in real, tangible ways.

Thank you for your generosity, your faith, and the many ways you make ministry possible. My prayer is that this becomes a visible act of worship for all generations—a moment when we commit ourselves not only to the life of the church but to the mission of Christ Himself.

SESSION DIGEST

The Session of Brownson met on Monday, October 20.

Devotional - Elder Bill Berger presented the meeting's devotional, which recounted his personal experience in the Air Force and practicing law. He recounted a story related to an Air Force member who was disabled following a work accident. Bill served as the plaintiff attorney for a subsequent lawsuit with a sizeable judgement won. Bill's client elected to donate all proceeds to charity as he considered it an "Act of God" that allowed him to live and provide blessings to others. What an inspiring illustration of perceiving God's benevolence despite an apparent tragic event.

Endowment Realignment - David Wood, Co-chair of Stewardship Ministry and Michael Gantt, Chair of Brownson's Endowment Committee presented an endowment realignment proposal, previously reviewed and approved by the Coordinating Council on 10/13/25. The proposal involves transferring \$300,000 from the Main Endowment to the designated Personnel Endowment to better manage the expected and beyond our control increased personnel expenses related to higher healthcare costs as dictated by the PC (USA) Board of Pensions. After discussion, the proposal was approved by vote of Session with final passage requiring a second vote at next month's Session meeting.

All Together Proposal - Rev. Hage introduced the "Way Forward Plan and Proposal." This proposal reflects a synthesis of deliberations by the Worship Ministry team to pursue an All Together Planning Process. The vision of the Plan is to strengthen the immediate opportunities for connection and belonging and to launch a deliberate, facilitated process to potentially develop an innovative, inclusive worship model that is truly intergenerational and reflects Brownson's purpose and direction. It was noted that this effort was not a result of any current church struggle but rather designed to discern what opportunities for growth and discipleship might lie ahead. The hope is to identify aspects that make Brownson unique and ways to enhance the mission outreach presence in the community, following the discussion, the "Way Forward Plan and Proposal" initiative passed by Session vote.







Congregational Care & Connection Updates





A is For Alabaster: 52 Reflections on the Stories of Scripture by Anna Carter Florence



STAFF PICK | Elizabeth Doolin, Associate Pastor for Congregational Care and Connection

I was recently feeling stale in my connection to scripture and ordered this book on a whim, hoping for a devotional that would offer inspiration. *A is For Alabaster* did not disappoint! Anna Carter Florence, a professor of Homiletics at Columbia Theological Seminary, offers this collection of fifty-two reflections in the form of an *abecedary:* an alphabetical primer covering both the Old and New Testaments. She touches on stories both familiar and obscure, illuminating their depths in ways that felt fresh and exciting. In her introduction, she describes the book this way: "a glimpse of how reading the Bible *could* be; how *we* could be, with a little more room and freedom." This is how reading scripture through her eyes felt: like a dive into cool waters, swimming through the adventure and possibility of God's kingdom as revealed in scripture.
