## Music Notes

Richard Smallwood, a gospel singer and recording artist nominated eight times for Grammy Awards, passed away on December 31, 2025. He was 77. Smallwood's songs were performed and recorded over the years by artists such as Whitney Houston, Stevie Wonder, Destiny's Child, and Boyz II Men. Singer Chaka Khan wrote after his death, "His music didn't just inspire me, it transformed me. He is my favorite pianist, and his brilliance, spirit, and devotion to the music have shaped generations, including my own journey." *Total Praise* became a modern-day hymn that touched people from all types of backgrounds and walks of life. You can go into any kind of church — a Black church, a white church, a nondenominational church — and you might hear that song. Somehow it found its footing throughout the whole Christian world.
