Financial

controlling money, limiting access to resources, preventing employment



Spiritual

misusing scripture or faith authority to justify control or silence survivors



Verbal

yelling, name-calling, belittling, constant criticism, or threats



Physical

hitting, pushing, restraining, or threatening harm



Emotional

insults, humiliation, manipulation, or isolation



Sexual forcing or coercing sexual acts without consent

70% of survivors first reach out for help within their faith community before going anywhere else.
