Pastor's Reflections for December 2025



Grace and peace to you from Christ our Lord and from your sisters and brothers at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church. The Advent season is here! As we enter December working our way toward Christmas, we have a full calendar of events and happenings for you and your family and friends to participate in. This year we will have our Wednesday midweek soup and sandwich dinners at 6pm in the fellowship hall followed by midweek Advent service with Holden Evening Prayer beginning at 7pm. The Youth are preparing to perform their Christmas play, "The Fumbly Bumbly Angels" on Sunday Dec. 14th during the worship. We have the honor this year of hosting the evening Ecumenical community Longest Night/Blue Christmas service here at Prince of Peace Thursday Dec. 18th. The Longest Night/ Blue Christmas service is intended to be spiritual support for any people or families who have lost loved ones this year or during the Christmas season. The Nassau area schools release for the Christmas break on Dec. the 19th. The Choir is preparing their special cantata service for Sunday Dec. 21st during worship. The Christmas Eve worship this year will begin at 6pm this year. We encourage everyone to arrive early as we are expecting a large community for worship this evening and want to make sure that we get everyone properly seated. There will be overflow seating in the Narthex and we will live stream the Worship to the fellowship hall for any of the littles (and parents who need to use the nursery).

With a calendar this full of worship events and activities it is easy to feel so busy this season that you don't have time to sit and take in the season of Advent. Advent is traditionally a time of waiting and preparation both for the celebration of Jesus Birth but also in expectation for the second coming of Jesus which is yet to come. All the commitments and busy schedules lend themselves toward focusing on preparation and the action we need to take to be ready, however much of what the Advent season is focused on is waiting. Waiting for God's timing, waiting to play our part in the story of God's Messiah, waiting to see the promised kingdom of God fully revealed to the world. Waiting in expectation is not something that anyone enjoys, much like little children waiting for Christmas morning presents. We all want the waiting to be over and the time to be here. However, in the waiting we are all unified in a common feeling and deep desire. The waiting brings us together much more than the busy preparation. We wait together, while preparation sends us apart to accomplish goals and tasks. While we wait together this season, let us reflect on the strengths of being together. Everyone is welcome to wait, no one is the best or the worst at waiting, nothing has to be done in order to keep waiting, and while we are waiting we all want the same thing. The nice things about waiting is the acceptance that we are not in Control but God is in Control. I hope that we enjoy are time waiting knowing God is in Control and finding some peace this advent season.

COUNCIL PRESIDENTS MESSAGE



We enter the Advent season on Sunday, November 30. As I pondered the meaning of Advent, I went to the old stand-by Webster's Dictionary and looked up Advent: "the period beginning the four Sundays before Christmas" – well, I knew that, but what does it mean? The dictionary referred me to the synonym for Advent: "arrival". Looking up "arrival", I found that Advent applies to "a momentous or conspicuous arrival, an appearance upon a scene esp. for the first time or a beginning." This beginning is why we celebrate Advent – to prepare for the arrival of Jesus.

I was led to this beautiful poem/hymn by Richard Wilbur by the ELCA's theme for Advent which is "A Stable Lamp is Lighted". This is the first verse:

A stable lamp is lighted whose glow shall wake the sky; the stars shall bend their voices, and every stone shall cry.
And every stone shall cry, and straw like gold shall shine; a barn shall harbour heaven, a stall become a shrine......

Advent season is stressful due to all the activities and demands of the season. We all must find balance in our lives to maintain our spiritual, physical and mental health. I found the following suggestions by Richard J. Beckman (In "*Praying for Wholeness and Healing*") for maintaining balance:

Practice daily confession and forgiveness

Take care of your physical health

Be aware of your feelings and respond to them appropriately.

Practice as much humor as you can.

Pray frequently for the fruit of the Spirit.

Practice the presence of God. Think particularly of God's goodness, faithfulness, steadfast love, compassion and joy.

I'm going to try to put these suggestions into practice. I hope you too will find them helpful and I wish you and the Prince of Peace community a blessed Advent journey to the stable.

HOW DOES OUR ENDOWMENT WORK?

Creating an endowment is more than a financial decision—it's a reflection of our commitment to being a mission-centered church. It allows us to support benevolent giving not for just today, but for generations to come. So how does it work? Let's break it down.

Our endowment is governed by documents generated by the Endowment Board, with a top-level controlling document approved by both the Church Council and the congregation. These documents outline the responsibilities of the Endowment Board which oversees both the operational framework and the investment strategy.

Whether gifts are made immediately or later as part of a legacy, they follow a clear process.

Example: A contribution of \$1,000 is received. Since this meets the minimum required by Thrivent Charitable Impact & Investing, the funds are invested and apportioned according to a risk strategy defined by the Endowment Board. Any contributions less than \$1,000 are collected in a separate bank account until the minimum of \$1,000 is achieved for investing.

Once invested, the contribution becomes part of the fund principal—it doesn't disappear!

Contributions remain in the fund and continue as working capital subject to market performance. Here's how it supports ongoing generosity:

- •Grants begin either on the 4th year of endowment inception or if the endowment balance reaches \$70,000.
- •Only a portion of the <u>annual earnings</u> is eligible for withdrawal to support grants.
- •For instance, if the \$1,000 earns \$100 in a given year, a portion of that \$100 will be included in grants.
- •Grant allowances begin at 50% of annual gains for the first 10 years of the life of the endowment fund and increase to 90% thereafter. In this example, \$50 would be included in a grant issuance.
- •The remainder of earnings (the other \$50) is reinvested, allowing the principal to grow further along with new contributions over time—even as grants are annually awarded.

Grant issuances are paused only in years when the investment experiences a net loss. In all other years, the Endowment Board declares gains for distribution, working closely with the Outreach Committee to ensure alignment with our mission. This structure ensures that every gift—large or small—has the potential to grow and serve others for years to come. It's a beautiful way for Prince of Peace to turn generosity into a lasting impact that changes lives for the better.

Council Meeting Highlights for November 17, 2025

Meeting called to order at 5:30 pm.

- Pastor Ben reported 5 new members joined POP on November 4th and there were two baptisms.
- Treasurer's Report was presented and approved through October 31, 2025.
- John Harris reported 32 Stewardship pledge cards were returned. Time and talent forms were reviewed, and members will be contacted re: their areas of interest.
- Search for organist continues. Council expressed appreciation and thanks for Diane Demeranville's continued service in the music ministry as we search for a new organist/pianist.
- Pastor Ben presented proposal for the playground project. Projected cost is \$6800 with no increase in insurance premiums based on following Church Mutual guidelines. Council approved moving forward with the project. Project will move forward as funds are raised.
- Discussed publishing a new photo directory and investigating if we could accomplish this in-house.
- Zoom bible study on book of Job will be held in January. Details upcoming.
- New cleaning service started in October, and cleanliness of church has improved.
- October mission raised \$525 for ELCA disaster relief.
- Over 40 people have signed up for Thanksgiving at church. November 15 bonfire was a success with over 50 people attending.

Meeting adjourned at 7:00 pm.



Annual Meeting Highlights for November 9, 2025

- The Annual Meeting was held on November 9th . A quorum was established with approximately 50 members present.
 - The 2026 budget was passed with one amendment to not renew wind/hail insurance premium and instead deposit the estimated \$20,000 premium to the Disaster Relief Fund.
 - The Audit Committee report was presented by Pastor Pat Harris with no significant issues. The committee found the books and records of POP to be in good order and commended Treasurer Robin Phillips for the thoroughness of the records.
 - Bart Cormier presented revisions to the Mission Endowment Board document which were approved. (See Annual Report on the changes). Bart also reported the current fund balance is >\$100,000 which has surpassed expectations. This will allow potential to award grants in 2026.
 - Rich Eckwall presented Nominating Committee recommendations for Council: John Harris, Garrett Price, Dennis Purdy and Dana Sargent. Nominations were approved.
 - Nominations for 2026 Nominating Committee were Judi Langholz (outgoing Council member), John Mandrick, Brenda Ronson and Tanya Adin. Nominations were approved.
 - Nomination for Endowment Board vacancy was Sue Farmer. Nomination was approved.
- Meeting was adjourned at 12:30 pm.
