Approval of September 2025 Vestry Minutes

Linda made a motion to accept the minutes as submitted, Betsy seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Rector's Report

September was a full month:

*We kicked off the fall ministry programs with another well attended Hoe-Down.

*The choir has strong participation, and is temporarily under the care of Terry Butler, while Mary is away on maternity leave.

*Middle and Senior High youth group have had very good attendance (42 average attendance). Ezra and Betty have been out and about at student events (e.g. sports, senior speeches, etc.).

*Theology on Tap was full.

*Fr. Nigel is leading a "Level 2" class on healing prayer.

*The Women's Bible Study has had solid attendance and participation on Wednesday nights and Thursday mornings--averaging well over 100.

*The children's ministry continues to have good participation.

Junior Warden's Report

- The water leaks affecting the basement have been addressed and repairs made. To the right of the main door, at ground level, a new membrane has been put in place, and a cracked pipe replaced.
- It was discovered the exterior window sill on the second floor outside the elevator had rotted and water was getting into the interior wall and causing several leaks on the first floor to the right of the office. A new window will be installed to alleviate this issue.
- Repairs are now being made to the interior wall of the Sanctuary. The first step will be to seal the cinder blocks, then the lath and the plaster drywall will be added.
- The second floor exterior wall bricks are being sealed by Joey de Stephano.
- Bathroom floors of Montessori are being epoxied in the near future.
- Exterior wood above the kitchen near the heat pumps and exhaust fans are due to be sealed, caulked and painted
- Galilee will be working with a new landscaping company called Vigor Landscaping. Its owner is Jonathan Hughes.
- The Parking Team aims to have attendants in the upper and lower lot from 9:10-9:30 and from 10:10-10:30 to assist with parking and transporting some of our parishioners from the lower lot to the upper lot. There continue to be some challenges, especially since our golf cart was stolen. Robbie Berndt has found a cart similar to the one we had. Insurance will cover \$4K towards a new one after we satisfy our deductible. Bryant McGann plans to institute a schedule for the volunteers which he hopes will improve volunteer attendance each Sunday.

Please make special note of the Newcomer Dinner on November 9th and welcome our new members warmly, whether it be at the dinner or when you see them in the coming weeks.

Golf carts are continuing operation on Sunday mornings thanks to the loaned carts from the Buchanan and Wilkins families. A replacement cart is being researched. Organ installation is making steady progress, and the leaks our building experienced during September storms are being addressed.
