Theme: Two Buckets

Scripture: James 1:14-15

"Temptation comes from our own desires, which entice us and drag us away. These desires give birth to sinful actions. And when sin is allowed to grow, it gives birth to death."

A Thought:

Gentlemen, sometimes we wonder why we do not grow in our faith? Oh, we go to church, we are involved in church activities, possibly we even attend a weekly bible class. In our personal inner sanctum where the travails of our secret life exist and flourish (sinful desires) we confront the bully of all bullies: sin. The bully sin hangs on us like a sweaty t-shirt after a hard work out. Simply we live two lives. Factoid: fellows, our religious activities do not get us closer to our Lord Jesus. If we continue to have sin in our lives all this "religious" hustle and bustle is in vain. Evangelist Billy Graham says as much in his book The Journey "Why don't we grow in our faith? Sometimes it's because of a particular sin we have tolerated and allowed to block God's work, refusing to admit it or give it up." The bully Satan loves the idea that he can hover over us with our "sin secrets" and feed our appetites with sinful delights. He knows that religious activities are not a problem. However, our personal relationship with our Lord through conversation and prayer the bully Satan cannot handle. We can make the break from a sinful nature. Our Lord does not leave us at the edge of fuzziness. Remember Jesus was exalted by God Philippians 2-9-11b "and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord"...tough luck Satan. Here is the scriptural slam-dunk as stated in Romans 8:1-2 (NIV) "Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus." Satan is a loser when we adhere to the second part of verse 2 "because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit of life set me free from the law of sin and death." Now....what are your thoughts? Write them down.

Okay, you're home, you parked the car in the garage and you take the two buckets out of the trunk. Which bucket do you leave in the grungy garage and which one will you take into the confines of your home...hmm? 1 Peter 4:2...
