Matthew 24

If the tribulation has already happened, what is *our* future?

Does Matthew 24:15 and 2 Thessalonians 2:1-13 refer to the same person?

Doesn't the comment in Matthew 24:15, "Let the reader understand" refer to future people reading Matthew 24?

If we interpret Scripture with Scripture, then why must we depend on justifying a position on extra-biblical writings?

What does it matter which eschatological view one holds?
