



“The Narrow Road of Faith”

(‘Inspirational fuel’ from Matthew 7:13-14 & Mark 5:21-43)

***“Enter through the narrow gate. For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction – and many enter through it! But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to life, and only a few find it.”
(Matt. 7:13-14)***

If we’ve entered the narrow gate; is that ‘enough’? Do we just sit safe & secure in our salvation? Through the “*narrow gate*” we go and are now safe & sound? We may be safe & secure, but are we living a *sound Christian life*?

Our challenge: How do we stay on the *narrow road* and live consistent & sound lives that glorify Jesus?

We *all* need God's inspiration to stay on the narrow road of faith in times of Crises, Fear. Trauma. Sickness. Isolation. Hard times. Depression. Unfair judgement & criticism. And even Death.

**1. A loving dad in a crisis of life and death
(*Mark 5:21–24*)**

May we continue come to Jesus for who He is – Lord & Savior not just some vending machine.

We need to continue to step out in faith in Jesus, even if it be dangerous & risky. So that the world may know Jesus also!

May we continue to seek Him, come to Him, and fall at His feet with such faith.

2. A Sick Woman's Faith (*Mark 5:25-34*)

Jesus is especially fond of you too!
Isa.49:16 - the Lord, “has our names engraved
on the palms of His hands.”

May we have faith, that if Jesus says “No” or
“not now” for healing, that we still keep our faith.
And may we too, have the courage of this
woman to come to Jesus and “touch His robe.”

3. A Dead Little Girl (*Mark 5:35-43*)

Don't ever take for granted our compassionate
Jesus! King Jesus, alone has the power over
sickness and death. Our faith can move
mountains.

May the powerful true stories & testimonies
from **God's inspired Word**, be the
'Inspirational Fuel' for **our faith-walks** and
help keep us on the *narrow road*.

Our personal life testimonies are *also* part of
God's continuing story. They can help & inspire
