## **Discussion Guide: Small Group Questions - RE: Returning to the Wall**

Read Nehemiah 12:27–43 Hebrews 12:1–2, 14–17

# 1. Preparation & Purification

- In Nehemiah 12:30, the Levites purified themselves before purifying the people and the wall. Why do you think it was important that they began with themselves?
- How does the idea of "personal purification" apply to our spiritual preparation for worship today? What does that look like in practice for you?

#### 2. Holiness Before God

- Hebrews 12:14 says, "Strive for peace with everyone, and for the holiness without which no one will see the Lord."
  - What does it mean to "strive" for holiness?
  - O What are some things that can make holiness difficult in your week-to-week life?

### 3. Celebration & Worship

- In Nehemiah 12, the dedication involved choirs, instruments, sacrifices, and great joy. Why do you think joy and thanksgiving were central to this celebration?
- When you think of your own worship—on Sundays or in daily life—what tends to fuel your joy? What tends to drain it?

## 4. God's Role in Our Joy

Nehemiah 12:43 says, "God had made them rejoice with great joy." How have you
experienced God as the source of your joy rather than your circumstances being the
source?

### 5. Living Prepared for Worship

- You mentioned in the sermon that some people approach Sunday worship as a "weekly fill-up," while others come prepared to celebrate God's faithfulness from the week.
  - Which of those mindsets is more natural for you?
  - What is one intentional step you could take this week to "prepare" yourself before coming to worship?

#### 6. Looking to Jesus

- Hebrews 12:1–2 calls us to "lay aside every weight and sin" and "look to Jesus."
  - What's one "weight" that tends to slow down your walk with Christ?
  - O What might it look like for you to "fix your eyes" on Jesus in that area this week?
