

From Pastor's Pen:

"Now on the first day of the week Mary Madalene came to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb." (John 20:1) Dearly blessed of the risen Savior.

For the past year we have received daily reports of the war in Ukraine; the mass murder of innocent civilians, the devastation and destruction of their communities and the bravery and fortitude of their people who seek to cast out an invading army. So many of our fellow Christians will soon be celebrating Easter on the battlefield or in their bombed out homes and places of worship. Yet, they have a valuable lesson to teach us.

You may not have known this, but many Ukrainian Easter cards portray gardens with beautiful flowers. An easily overlooked detail is that in every picture the gate to the garden is left ajar. The gate is left open in order to signify that during the season of Easter doors are opened.

This was what Mary Magdalene discovered when she arrived at the tomb that first Easter morning. In fact the much misunderstood hymn, "In the Garden" truly applies only to Mary. She came to the garden alone, while it was still dark and the dew was still on the roses. Yet, upon coming to the tomb she discovered that the stone had been taken away. It was open. At first she did not understand. She even asked Jesus, whom she mistook for a gardener, where they had taken her Lord's lifeless body. That is when, as the hymn declares, she heard a voice falling on her ear, and that voice called her by name. She recognized that sweet voice of Jesus as the Son of God disclosed to her the meaning of the open tomb.

On that first Easter morning our Savior opened what was locked. The seal to the grave was broken, the door to everlasting life was opened and the gate to heaven was left ajar so that all who would put their trust in Him could enter in. We celebrate this regularly in our worship, our weekly Easter. We hear and respond to the preface: "Jesus Christ our Lord... on this day overcame death and the grave and opened to us the way of everlasting life. therefore with angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven we laud and magnify His glorious name, evermore praising Him and saying, Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of Sabaoth..."

Through our Savior's resurrection doors have opened for us! And through our regular attendance in the Divine Service our Lord continues to open doors! He opens the doors to our hearts through His means of grace. In Word and Sacrament He opens the door for the Holy Spirit to enter in with His gifts of faith, life, salvation and much more. Praise God for all the doors He opens for us, because He first opened the door to the tomb in the garden.

Let us learn from, and celebrate with, our Ukrainian brothers and sisters the wonderful blessings of the open doors of Easter. The door to our once fearful and sorrowful hearts is open! The door to everlasting life and heaven is open! And it is all because, Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!

Vicar's View

When Did Jesus Die?


For my informer article, I wanted to focus on a rare coincidence about this Easter season that I didn't want to let pass without remarking on it: I believe that this year, Good Friday and Easter happen to fall on the same dates that Jesus actually died and rose again: April 7 and April 9.

Why do I think that? There is various information that can help determine when Jesus died. The most obvious factor to start with is that Jesus was crucified under the authority of Pontius Pilate, who reigned from A.D. 26 to A.D. 37. So Jesus must have died sometime in those years. We can narrow things down much more than that though. All four Gospels agree that Jesus was crucified and died on a Friday afternoon, right before the Sabbath (Mark 15:42, Matt. 27:62, Luke 23:54, John 19:31). But John's Gospel especially points out that Jesus was crucified on the day when the Passover meal would be eaten at sunset, Nisan 14 in the Jewish calendar (see John 18:28; 19:29 and 19:36 connect Jesus with the Passover lamb sacrificed on that day). There are only two years that Nisan 14 fell on a Friday in that time period: A.D. 30 and A.D. 33.

To determine which date is more likely, we can turn to some other information. Luke 3:1 indicates that Jesus started his ministry in the 15th year of Tiberius Caesar or shortly thereafter. It's not exactly clear how Luke counts those years, but this would be somewhere between A.D. 27-29. This also agrees with a comment made in John 2:20 that the temple had been under construction for 46 years toward the beginning of Jesus' ministry, which would put it at A.D. 27-28. On the other side of things, historical information from Acts indicates that Paul's conversion on the Damascus road must have occurred around A.D. 34, and we know that this was after he had been persecuting Christians for some period of time. Therefore, since it isn't likely that Jesus' ministry was longer than about three years, A.D. 33 would likely make Jesus' ministry too long and put his death and resurrection too close to Paul's conversion. Thus Jesus most likely died in A.D. 30, and in that year, Passover began on April 7. That is 1993 years to the day before Good Friday 2023!

Of course, there is nothing magical about that. The celebration of Christ's death and his victorious resurrection has the same joyful meaning every single year: Christ has defeated death by his death and brought immortality to light in his resurrection! That is no more or less true based on what day we celebrate. But I hope that this "fun fact" will help you to appreciate a little more this season that Christ's work for us happened on a very real Friday at a very real time in our human history. And that is worth celebrating.

 - At least 110 pounds
 - Feeling well on the day of donation
 - Haven't taken aspirin products 48 hours before donating.
- Be sure that your last donation date was no sooner than March 11, 2023 Have you been deferred for visiting or living in a European country because of Mad Cow Disease?
 - Don't worry if you have been previously denied for giving blood because of living or visiting European countries in the 80s and 90s. The FDA has lifted this previously stated restriction for this large group of people because Mad Cow disease is no longer an issue.

How to prepare for your donations.

- Drink lots of water to be well hydrated
- Eat before you come
- Bring your photo ID
- Some people who have been deferred in the past for low hemoglobin take an iron supplement (everyday or every other day) to prepare.
