#### From Pastor's Pen:

The other day I found it quite amusing and somewhat entertaining to listen to a couple of people go on and on about what a horrible gossip someone else was. In the midst of reciting a litany of the less than admirable qualities of the accused person, they asked me to affirm that the Bible condemns gossip. All I could do was nod my head and smile at the irony of it all.

Do not get me wrong, I am as guilty as the next person when it comes to the 8<sup>th</sup> Commandment and bearing false witness against my neighbor. Mea culpa, mea maxima culpa! God's Word through James makes it clear how evil and destructive an unbridled tongue can be:

"Look at the ships also: though they are so large and are driven by strong winds, they are guided by a very small rudder wherever the will of the pilot directs. So also the tongue is a small member, yet it boasts of great things. How great a forest is set ablaze by such a small fire! And the tongue is a fire, a world of unrighteousness. The tongue is set among our members, staining the whole body, setting on fire the entire course of life, and set on fire by hell. For every kind of beast and bird, of reptile and sea creature, can be tamed and has been tamed by mankind, but no human being can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison. With it we bless our Lord and Father, and with it we curse people who are made in the likeness of God. From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brothers, these things ought not to be so." (James 3:4-10)

Think about the last time you cursed someone or something...did anything good come from it?

Think about the last time you "told someone off," "gave them a piece of your mind," or "put them in their place"...did it really benefit anyone?

Think about the last time you shared a juicy little bit of gossip...did it serve the people involved or edify the person you told?

Truly, our tongues are difficult to tame; a restless evil, filled with deadly poison. Thanks be to God our Lord Jesus Christ came to live and die to take away our sin, even the sin our tongue's misuse. In perfect obedience when He was mocked and reviled He returned only words of love and forgiveness. While being cursed by others, He offered only praise and prayers to His Father on behalf of those who sinned against Him. Even now, He is at the Father's right hand using His pure and glorified tongue to intercede for

Seeing what He has done, and continues to do for us, we are led to use our tongues differently – to glorify God and bless others. We have much better things to talk about than the flaws and failings of others. We have "Good News" to share about God's love and our Savior, Jesus Christ. We are blessed to be able to use our tongues to form words that encourage, strengthen & edify others. We get to use them to steer our lives and the lives of others in the way of forgiveness, mercy and love. So by the working of the Holy Spirit, let us strive to only allow blessing upon blessing to come out of our mouths.

#### **Food Pantry Report**

The following is a summary of the information that was presented to the voters at the June 11th Voters' Meeting\* regarding the financial struggles that are facing our Food Pantry. \*Some lines have been updated to reflect a month's change.

Summary: Expenses are going up, free food provided by the government is going down, numbers of families we serve each month is also going up, giving is not enough to pay for monthly expenses (The food pantry is only supported by offerings specifically designated to the Food Pantry. It has never been a line on the church's budget.)

After much discussion a motion was made at the June 11<sup>th</sup> Voters' Meeting to continue the food pantry by supporting it by means of reallocating funds from the vicar's salary \*\* to the food pantry from August to December, in the amount of \$1,200 per month which will be added to any Food Pantry Offerings that come in to match the projected \$1,500-\$1,800 monthly expenses. \*\*We no longer have the expenses of a vicar since we did not get a vicar for the 2<sup>nd</sup> half of the year.

This \$1,200 will certainly be a blessing, but it still will not cover the expected monthly expenses. We encourage you to, after your church tithes are in, to prayerfully consider including the food pantry in your giving.

#### Food Pantry FAQs

#### How many volunteer hours does it take to run the food pantry each week?

In addition to the 16 hours a week that the food pantry coordinator, Greg Burke gives, we are blessed by more volunteers that give 30-35 hours every week.

#### I see expensive cars pull up to the food pantry, why are we giving them food?

We never know everyone's stories. Legally, we cannot ask the income levels of our families. We do not discriminate based on any personal judgements or prejudices. We do know that some of our families need to borrow a car to pick up their food. And some other people who drive in are caretakers picking up for clients, or family members picking up for someone else.

#### What goes into each box?

That varies each week and each month based on what food is available for us to purchase from Riverbend Food Bank...and how much it costs. Bottom line is, we try to ensure each family receives fruits, vegetables, proteins, and yes, even treats. However, based on prices and availability, this might be harder to accomplish some weeks.

#### How often can people come to the food pantry?

Based on the rules set forth by Churches United and Riverbend Food Bank, a family can visit their designated food pantry (by geographic area) once a month.

#### Do we ask for donations from the families who receive these boxes of food?

No. The Food Pantry is purely a charitable service to those in our community who need help getting food. We do not ask the families we serve for anything in return for the food they receive, nor do we solicit donations from them.

#### Can you cut back on the amount of food you give to save money?

Orders are placed the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of every month with the food being delivered by Riverbend Food Bank on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday. Orders are placed using Riverbend's online ordering system. Food availability changes constantly and is shown in real time. The food pantry coordinator and the church secretary go through the shopping list first looking for the best deals. Example: a case of canned carrots is \$8.61, green beans are \$23.96; carrots are ordered. After they make out the order they are given a total cost; then they work backwards to cut back the order until it is within our budget.

Lackey attended the 2023 National Convention in Milwaukee June 22-25. Come see and hear what exciting things they have to share about where mission mites have gone and are going. LWML has funded mission projects in over 42 countries on 5 continents. LWML was founded in 1942 with a mission goal of \$15,000. This biennium goal is \$2,350,000 and will help fund 31 missions from India to North Dakota.

He is host of What-Not, The Podcast, posts videos on YouTube at wolfmueller1, and has a number of other theological projects that all end up on his blog, www.wolfmueller.co. Bryan is a member of the Doxology Collegium. He and his wife Keri live with their four children in Round Rock, TX.
