From Pastor's Pen:

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth. (John 1:1,14)

Dearly Blessed of the Lord,

Many years ago, when Video Cassette Recorders were just hitting the market, my father received one for a Christmas gift. At first, he was very excited about this wonderful gift. It allowed him to watch prerecorded movies, tape his favorite shows, and have the freedom of doing something else while his new machine watched television for him.

Things, however, were not that simple. Soon my dad's joy turned to anger, and a great deal of expressive language. The problem was that he could not get the (beeping) thing to do what he wanted. Even after reading all the instructions on installation, programing, recording and playback, he could not get it to work. Perhaps I should add that my father has never been the most mechanically or technologically advanced, nor is he very good at following instructions. I think that I may be the only child to have owned a tricycle with a rear facing seat positioned over the front wheel. Obviously, when it came to the VCR my father was in way over his head.

One weekend I came home to an angry and frustrated man who begged me to hook up his new VCR and show him how to use it. He confessed that what he needed was not better instructions, but someone to come along with the gift to save him from his ignorance.

When God gave us the gift of salvation through His Word, he didn't just send us a booklet of complicated instructions which we could neither understand nor follow. He sent His Son. In Jesus' birth we have the Word made flesh, Immanuel - God with us.

The miracle of Christmas is that God has given us the most precious gift of all. He has given us Himself in the person of Jesus Christ who was born of the virgin Mary. In the glad tidings of the birth of our Lord we see the glory of God in Christ. Christmas is the celebration of the mystery of the incarnation; God setting aside His riches to become the poor child born in a stable. There in the arms of Mary is the glory of God in a tiny package.

That tiny package went on to humble himself throughout His earthly life for us. Placing Himself under the law of God, He fulfilled it completely for us. Then, suffering the humiliation of death upon the cross, He paid the ransom price for our sins. The result is that we are now set free to be the children of God. Rising and ascending in glory, the Word in flesh gives us victory over sin, death and the power of the devil. He fills us with the certain hope of eternal life.

Thanks be to God! To us a child is born and a Son is Given. He comes to deliver us. He comes to fill us with the joy of our salvation-gift. O Come, let us adore Him. Christ the Lord!
