From Pastor's Pen:

"Be watchful, stand firm in the faith, act like men, be strong. Let all that you do be done in love." (1 Cor. 16:13-14)

Dear friends in Christ,

Oh, how the above words, given through the apostle Paul, need to be repeated to us today. So often we are weak kneed and spineless when it comes to standing up for what we believe and know to be true. A true spirit of love for our neighbor who is being led astray or even perishing in unbelief should compel us to be bold and courageous in our defense of the faith. Think of the martyrs through the millennia who have stood firm, made their strong confession and even sacrificed their lives for their faith, and for us.

This month I would like for you to consider the heroic actions of a number of princes and other civic leaders who laid their lives on the line for their faith at the Diet of Augsburg on June 25, 1530. With the whole world aligned against them, and under threat of death, these faithful laymen presented "The Augsburg Confession" to Emperor Charles V. This document, consisting of 28 short articles of Christian doctrine, was written by layman theologian, Philipp Melanchthon. While labelled "Lutheran" it is something much more. It presents the true statement of the Apostolic Christian faith over against the papists on the one hand, and radical protestants on the other.

In this age of "you have your truth and I have my truth" it is more important than ever that we thoroughly know and steadfastly confess "the truth" that God has revealed to us. I encourage you to take time this month to read "The Augsburg Confession," and join those brave men in presenting it to the world as your own.

Finally, do not give into a spirit of fear or timidity! You have received the Spirit of sonship and of power, so stop cowering to the threats and actions that come against you from the servants of Satan. "Be watchful, stand firm in the faith, act like men, be strong. Let all that you do be done in love." Do this in certainty that the one who endures to the end will be saved and will receive the crown of eternal life.

Vicar's View

The Image of God

I'd like to talk about an important biblical phrase and idea that I'm sure you've probably heard before, but probably isn't understood very well by most people: that is, what it means to be made "in the image of God." In Genesis 1:26-27, when God is creating human beings, he says, "let us make man in our image, after our likeness" followed by a poem that says, "So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them." The image of God is clearly an important idea, but unfortunately Genesis never tells us exactly what that means! So what is the image of God?


I believe the best way to understand this is that God gave the first humans both **qualities** that resemble God and the **task** of representing God to the rest of his creation. God equipped humans with qualities like freedom, reason, and life that reflect God's own characteristics (in a limited and finite way of course) so that they could fulfill the mission of ruling the earth on God's behalf, bringing order to it and filling it with life. That is why after God creates humans in his image, he tells them to fill the earth, subdue it, and have dominion over the other creatures.

The Hebrew word for "image" is actually the same word that gets used elsewhere in the Bible to describe idol statues of false gods. In the Ten Commandments, God tells Israel, "You shall not make for yourself a carved **image**, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or serve them." (Exodus 20:4-5a) People in the ancient world used images as representatives of their gods so that they could interact with the spiritual being behind it. Human kings also put "images" of themselves throughout their realm as symbols of their power and authority. In a way, God's original intention is for humans to fill this same role: to be the symbol of God's authority and to be a representative of God toward creation. That is why God forbid his people from using idol statues in worship; humans bowing down to other created objects as representatives of God (or "gods") is completely backwards! It is humans that should be the image of God, representing him to other creatures.

Unfortunately, when humans sinned, those image-of-God qualities were damaged and twisted. Our free-

dom was bound to evil and our reason and wisdom were perverted, and therefore we became totally unable to fulfill our task of representing God in the way he wants. But there is good news. Colossians 1:15 tells us that Jesus himself is the image of the invisible God. That is, he is the perfect human who restores the image of God in us. He accomplishes the task of ruling creation on God's behalf as a human, and he restores those godly qualities and attributes to us. Paul even writes in Romans 8:29 that Christians are being conformed to the image of Jesus. In other words, in Iesus we are going to be the image of God the way God always intended. Even now, you have the noble task of representing God to the world and showing other people what God is like, especially in his love and mercy. When Jesus returns, we will rule with him over God's creation as God's chosen representatives. I believe it gives us a whole new perspective when we see what a noble and beautiful role God has envisioned for us and for our fellow humans.

"My dad is stronger than your dad!" 12 year old Thomas said to his friends. An argument ensued regarding whose dad was strongest, richest, smartest, etc. Then the children began bragging about the important people their fathers knew. "My dad knows the mayor," one boy bragged. Another chimed in, "My dad knows a U.S. senator!" A third boy said, "My dad knows the governor!" Thomas didn't think his dad knew any important people. He didn't know what to say. Then he remembered that his dad would bring his mom and his two sisters to church every Sunday. His dad would often help with the worship service and sometimes remained afterwards to speak with the pastor. Thomas blurted out proudly, "My dad knows God!" The other boys were silent. Many people claim to know about God. But not nearly as many truly know God. To know about God means little. James 2:19 tells us that the devil knows that much! To know God is to know him as our Father and creator, and to rejoice that he knows us. To know God is to praise and honor him with our words and our actions. It is to believe what he says in the Bible, to frequently speak to Him in prayer, and to trust that through Jesus we are saved from sin and death.

Those who know God tell others about him. We do not brag about knowing God. Rather, we boast about all the wonderful things he has done and continues to do for us. This Father's Day, may we boast in the Lord and celebrate that we have a Father who loves us always and forever.

In other words, this is what the true Church of all times and all places has confessed. More than fifteen centuries later, the Church continues to confess this truth, confident that the triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, has given Himself for our salvation."
