From Pastor's Pen:

"Is not my word like fire, declares the LORD, and like a hammer that breaks the rock in pieces?" (Jer 23:29)

Dearly Beloved,

I realize that you may be expecting the usual November – *Let's count our blessings and be grateful* - epistle. I am sorry to disappoint, but there is something that is weighing heavy on my heart, and I wish to unburden it.

The goal of faithful ministry is supposed to be offering people a good conscience before God. Unfortunately, I feel that I have failed in this task. You see, offering people a good conscience before God, is not the same as telling people what they want to hear to make them feel good about themselves. I fear that I have done too much to deaden and weaken consciences, rather than awakening and strengthening godliness. Truthfully, you do not need me to help you with that

We live in a time and among a people who are very good at giving us things to weaken our consciences. Rather than inspiring us to seek a good conscience before God we are programmed to strive for the approval of others even when it means acting contrary to God's will or speaking against His Word. The result is that instead of turning to God's commandments to inform and awaken our conscience, we establish our own criteria for judging ourselves – criteria which is often very generous. When we sin we do not turn to Christ in true repentance for forgiveness and seek to amend our wicked ways, but use the Gospel as an excuse to go on sinning. The easiest way to deaden and weaken our conscience before God is to stay away from His Word, which far too many of the sheep who have been placed under my care are doing.

Setting aside worship and God's Word makes it much easier to establish our own rules, call ourselves "good", and live with an untroubled conscience. The problem is that it leaves us with a bad and unclean conscience before God.

The prophet Jeremiah, speaking to people whose consciences had been deadened and weakened writes, "Is not my word like fire, declares the LORD, and like a hammer that breaks the rock in pieces?"

For those of you who have gone camping, you know how important a fire is at night. On a cold night it keeps you warm. In the dark it gives light. The smoke chases off the bugs. You can grill hot dogs and marshmallows with it. You can purify water with it. It keeps animals away. And it's also fun just to sit and look at it. It's a very powerful tool. God said, that's what my word is like! A fire! It's powerful - it can penetrate your stony soul! It can warm up your cold heart! It can purify you! It can give you light in this dark world! It can distinguish the truth from error! It can feed you and purify you! It can drive away the prowling lion who seeking to devour you!

Luther said, "If you take the Word away it is like taking the sun away from the earth. If the Word were removed, what would the world be but a hell and a mere realm of Satan, though people of wealth, lawyers, doctors, etc., dwelt in it? For only the Word keeps a joyful conscience, a gracious God, and all of religion, since out of the Word, as from a spring, flows our entire religion."

As your pastor I ask your forgiveness for being "nice" to the point that I may have led to the deadening and weakening of your consciences. I say, "enough of that! Back to God's Word!" I call you to return to the Word in personal devotions, Bible study and worship so that you may truly recognize your sin before God, be Spirit led to confess that sin and ask for forgiveness. Then, you will surely find in Jesus Christ a good conscience before God.

Notes from the Balcony

Thanksgiving Hymn Challenge

The Lutheran Service Book includes four Thanksgiving hymns. One, LSB 895 *Now Thank We All Our God*, is a favorite hymn of one of our members. The other hymns in our hymnal are: #892 *Come, Ye Thankful People, Come, #893 Sing to the Lord of Harvest,* and #894 *For the Fruits of His Creation*. Can you match the following description with these hymns?

- 1. Rev. Fred Pratt Green (1903-2000), an English Methodist minister, wrote this hymn in 1970. Other hymns written by Green found in our hymnal are *When in Our Music God is Glorified* and *How Clear Is Our Vocation Lord*. Green's written works include plays, collections of poetry, and over 300 hymns. The first stanza of this Thanksgiving hymn thanks God the Father for His work and care of creation. In the second, we follow Christ's example of caring for others. The third stanza proclaims thankfulness for the work of the Spirit.
- 2. The Irish Anglican chaplain and rector, John S. B. Monsell (1811-1875), wrote this hymn. After serving in Ireland until 1853, he was transferred to England. His death resulted from a fall from the roof of a church under construction. In addition to writing about 300 hymns, Monsell also published eleven volumes of poetry. LSB 664, *Fight the Good Fight*, was also written by Monsell. His Thanksgiving hymn in our hymnal was first published in Monsell's *Hymns of Love and Praise for the Church's Year*. Of these hymns, he wrote, "[These hymns] are practical, not theoretical; not the cold musings of the head of one at ease; but the warm gushings of the heart." Monsell referred to Jeremiah 5:24, "Let us fear the LORD our God, who gives the rain in season, the autumn rain and the spring rain, and keeps for us the weeks appointed for the harvest" in regard to this hymn.
- 3. This hymn was written by Henry Alford (1810-1871). The fifth generation of English clergymen in his family, he was raised by his father as his mother died giving birth to Henry. An early scholar, by the age of eight, had written a collection of Latin odes. He was known as a poet, preacher, painter, musician, and writer. His greatest written work was a four-volume commentary on the Greek New Testament which took him twenty years to write. His determination to persevere in his task is attested to by an incident where after having been thrown from his horse on the way to a lecture, although wearing bandages and noticeably shaken, he arrived on time and completed his task. The Thanksgiving hymn in our hymnal was written for a rural church to be sung during a harvest celebration. This hymn invites the singers to join in thanksgiving to God, recounts the parable of the wheat and tares, and closes by inviting the Lord to begin the final harvest.
- 4. Martin Rinckart (1586-1649) was born in Germany and was the son of a cooper. Martin held Lutheran pastoral positions and eventually served as an archdeacon. During this time, the Thirty Years War caused great hardship to his city including a plague that killed over eight thousand people including Rinkart's wife. In one year, as the only pastor left, he officiated four thousand funerals, with as many as fifty in one day. A famine followed the plague and Rinckart organized help for the hungry people including contributing out of his own funds. In spite of terrible hardship, Martin wrote this hymn as a mealtime prayer for his family. His three-stanza hymn thanks God for his wondrous and bountiful blessings both now and in eternity.



September 24, 2023

Meeting opened with a reading by Pastor Umbarger, and a prayer.

Board Reports

- 1. Treasurer's report given by Norm Antolik
 - a. Elders' budget was adjusted as vicar expense is gone
 - b. Human Care \$6000 going to food pantry
 - c. Utilities MidAmerican was paid with credit card to get the cash reward from the credit card.
- 2. Board of Youth and Family report given by Rebecca Hinman
 - a. Upcoming events
 - i. October 29 Trunk or Treat
 - ii. November lock up
 - iii. Thanksgiving potluck
 - iv. December Comedy Sportz
 - v. December Circa 21
- 3. Board of Outreach report given by Charlie Britton
 - a. Making visitor calls
 - b. Handing out packets to parents at Trunk or Treat encouraging them to bring their children to worship and Sunday School.
 - c. In process to see who is willing to stay on as fellowship callers, and looking for new members for 2024.
- 4. Board of Elders report given by Jim Homann
 - a. Church office is working on move away letters to members who moved. First and second letter have suggestions with other churches in their area, 3rd year letter is a dismissal letter.
- 5. Board of Trustees report given by Evan Antolik
 - a. Still getting bids on the roof, which has put the parking lot on hold.
 - b. Threat Assessment by Homeland Security was done. There is grant money available which will open in a few months. There will be more to come.
 - c. Few minor maintenance issues
 - d. Boiler should kick on soon
 - e. Will be working on landscape/grass
 - f. Sign will be updated will start to include Bible verse weekly and events.
 - g. It was recommended that Trustees put the Courtyard on budget for next year
- 6. Board of Human Care report given by Carrie Homann See attached report
 - a. Food Pantry numbers continue to increase, we having been giving out over 100 boxes each month since July. They are thankful for the increased funds given to the food pantry.
 - b. Blood Drive is October 21

- c. There will be an Advanced Directive Class October 28 at 10:30am. This class is for anyone 18 years and older.
- d. In the early stages of planning a congregational trip June 2024. It would include St. Louis, Eureka Springs Arkansas, Branson Missouri. The cost of chartering a bus has increased beyond what they are wanting to spend. We will need to be creative with transportation or scale back on the plans for the trip.
- e. Fellowship committee is planning for in house and local activities. Next meeting is Wed October 11 at 4pm.
- 7. Executive Board report given by Rod Hopkins see attached report
 - a. The executive board is seeking members to fill or assist with a few positions in 2024. John Iwen is stepping down as Financial Secretary. Also need an assistant treasurer to work the Norm Antolik, with a goal of taking over as treasurer. Will be forming a nominating committee for board members for all boards. Brian Engebrecht will be leading the nomination committee.
 - Financial audit was conducted and completed by a committee that consisted of two members.
 - c. The executive board and parish planning committee are developing a job description for possibly calling a new church worker. A job description and salary will be agreed upon by the members and possibly be presented to the voters at the December voters meeting. Questions from members on if this would be a called vs non-called position, at this time they are thinking it will be a called position. Questions about budget, this will need to be a line item in the budget meeting in December.
 - d. October 12 Parish Planning meeting if anyone has something they think this person should do they should give those recommendations to a board member.
 - e. Discussed the condominium that is owned by the church. We have had it since July 2013, paid \$60,000. We have put \$15,3000 into renovations. Currently is tax exempt as it was being used for a church worker. If we still have it after December 31st we may have to start paying taxes. Questions by members if it could be used by whomever accepts the called position, discussed that we do not know if they would want it. Motion made by Ralph Grotelueschen to sell the condo. Seconded by Larry Dodge. Voted on and passed unanimously. The items in the condo were discussed. It was decided that the boards should discuss the use/donation of the items left in the condo.

Norm Antolik stated that budget 2024 information from all boards is needed by December 1st.

Evan Antolik made a motion to dismiss the meeting. Jim Homann seconded. Motion passed. Voters meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.


