"Heart Problems" Malachi 1:1-2:9

Dispute #1 (Malachi 1:2-5)

Focus: God's love for His people.

- The people interpreted their hardships as a lack of love on God's part.
- God reminded them that He had <u>chosen them</u> to be His people and had <u>saved them</u> to share His goodness with <u>the nations</u>.

Dispute #2 (Malachi 1:6 – 2:9)

Focus: Israel's illegitimate worship.

- The people went through the <u>motions</u> of worship, but their <u>hearts</u> were <u>far from</u> God.
- God pointed to the <u>flawed sacrifices</u> of His people as evidence of their <u>disdain</u> for Him.
- 1. Our tendency to question God's <u>goodness</u> and His <u>love</u> for us is a <u>cancer</u> to our relationship with Him.
- 2. If we want to know if God <u>loves</u> us, we need look no further than <u>the cross</u>.
- 3. God deserves our absolute best, and <u>everything we do</u> is an expression of our <u>love</u> for Him or our <u>lack</u> of it. (John 4:24, Romans 12:1)
- 4. When worshipping God becomes a chore for us, we've lost sight of who He is.
- 5. God will receive the glory that He's due, and if we don't seek to make <u>His name great</u>, the <u>loss</u> will be <u>ours</u>, not <u>His</u>. (Malachi 1:11)
