Fulfilled in Judas' betrayal of Jesus (Matthew 27:3-10).

Zec 12:1–14 (Looking on the Pierced One)

God's promise to defend Jerusalem and bring about a great national repentance.

Fulfilled in Jesus' crucifixion (John 19:37; Revelation 1:7).

Zechariah 13:7–9 (Striking the Shepherd)

A warning of God striking His shepherd, scattering the people, yet refining a faithful remnant as His own.

Fulfilled in Jesus' arrest and the scattering of disciples (Matthew 26:31)
