- 4. In attempting to "rob God" the people only robbed themselves of God's blessings.

## **Biblical Giving**

- 4. Giving is an act of worship, a reflection of gratitude, and an expression of trust in God.

- 6. Generosity helps to free us from the love of money and the bondage of materialism.
- 7. Generous giving enables the church to do its job well and to practice generosity.
