The Message of Jesus:

Words That Changed the World

Two point four billion people today claim to be followers of Jesus. Another 1.9 billion Muslims hail Jesus as a prophet. Large numbers of people of other faiths, and of no faith, look at Jesus as a "great moral teacher." But beyond a few verses, few seem to know what Jesus actually taught. In fact, much of what people think Jesus taught, he never said. And when Christians today summarize their faith, they often do so by speaking of Jesus's death for their sins and his resurrection.

When we look closely at the Gospels, we see Jesus's words and teachings are profoundly important. The four New Testament Gospels record approximately twenty-five thousand unique words of Jesus. Simon Peter said of Jesus's teaching, "You have the words of eternal life" (John 6:68).

The words of eternal life. Jesus's words were • Luke 23:33-34a, 39-43, 46 consequential. If you want to follow him today, knowing he died and rose again is not enough. You are meant to know what he taught about God and God's will for humanity. We're meant to embrace these words and seek to live them.

In this sermon series, we will explore the words of Jesus. You will walk through the major themes and most significant ideas Jesus taught throughout the Gospels.

Using The Message of Jesus based on a study from Adam Hamilton as the basis for a sermon series is an engaging and effective way to bring together your entire community of faith around the life-changing, worldchanging words of Jesus. It will speak to longtime Christians and those brand new to faith, leading them to a fresh encounter with the most important things Jesus taught and how they can transform our lives,



February was a good financial month, with higher-than-expected income and lower expenses. The month had a positive cash flow of around \$6000.00. Overall, YTD, we are negative \$1540.00. Here are a couple of things to keep in mind as we move through the fiscal year. The checking account started with less cash on hand than it did in 2024, which may lead to a cash flow problem during the lean months of giving. Each year, the foundation subsidizes the Director of the Family Ministry, but this comes with a planned decrease in the amount of funding from the foundation. This year, the foundation will provide \$10,000 less than last year, as anticipated. This could create a cash flow issue as the year progresses. We need to increase our giving as a congregation by \$10,000 to offset this.

We encourage all members who give to the church on an ongoing basis to consider electronic giving. This will ensure that the church has cash flow that it can count on each month. If 35 % of our givers give electronically, it will help with cash flow issues in the lean months.
