## The "Chrismon" Christmas Tree

Chi-Rho

Star of David

Five Pointed Star

Each one of us here today will be a part of decorating our tree this year! Every child and then each family, as supplies last, will be handed an ornament to hang on our Sanctuary tree during today's service.

Frances Kipps Spencer created the first Chrismon tree in 1957. Spencer wanted to decorate a tree with spiritually connected ornaments rather than merely secular items. The evergreen tree remained as the backdrop, symbolizing everlasting life, a tenet of the Christian faith. The tradition took root, and Chrismon trees grew to become a staple in Methodist, Presbyterian, Lutheran and interdenominational Protestant churches.

The word "crismon" is a contraction of the two words "Christ" and "Monogram". A Christmas tree decorated with these Christian monograms or "crismon" symbols from Christian history, tells the story of the true spiritual meaning of Christmas. It's meant to be a reminder that Christmas is about more than just the presents and the fun. It's about our shared history throughout the ages and it points us back to the baby Jesus in the manger who grew to be the Savior of the world. Here is the meaning behind each Chrismon:

	Irish or "Celtic Cross"	A normal cross with a circle in the middle to symbolize eternity.
	Triumphant Cross	Represents the earth with the cross on top, reminding us that Jesus is triumphant over the whole earth.
15887	Crown	Symbol representing Jesus as King.
	Furca or "Upsilon Cross"	Comes from the Greek letter Y. It is also called the "Thieves' Cross" from the two robbers who were crucified on each side of Jesus.
	Anchor Cross	Reminds Christians that Jesus is the anchor of their faith
	Fish	One of the oldest Christian symbols
	Alpha and Omega	The first and the last letters of the Greek alphabet. Used together, they symbolize that we believe Jesus is the beginning and end of all things.
D		Looks like a P with an X on top of it. These two let-

- 2) Grief Share has asked Gretchen if she could be a substitute leader for that ministry in the future (about 6-8 times per year). The Pastor Staff Parish Relations Committee [PSPRC] will discuss this at their next meeting.
- 3) Gretchen inquired if the Children's Music Room could be used as a Family Life space. She will put together a proposal for the council to consider at their December meeting.

#### **Cutting Edge Issues:**

**Item #1: 2024 Pastoral Compensation:** James Jenson reported that the PSPRC is recommending a 3% increase for Pastor Daren's compensation (it represents a \$1100 salary increase for the first six months of the 2024 year). They also recommend that the 85% /15% mileage figures should be charged 100% to each church's use. Both motions carried.

**Item #2: 2023 Financial Update:** Ellen Hoefker reported that our financial position is not too bad (we are current with all of our expenses, including apportionments, but we have used \$19,000 of our surplus to help pay our bills through the first ten months of the year). We continue to be grateful for the faithful giving of our congregation.

The next council meeting is set for **Thursday, December 21st at 5:30 p.m..**



Here are the highlights from the First Covenant Council meeting held on Thursday, November 16.

#### **Celebrations:**

The Missions Team reported that they put together 116 boxes for Operation Christmas Child (OCC), packed on Wednesday, November 1st. The Cristo en tu Ayuda congregation has packed over 60 boxes. The boxes will be blessed at the worship service on Sunday and then taken to the American Reformed Church where the OCC drop site is. We are very appreciative of the monetary donations that helped to purchase soccer balls, pumps, & jump ropes along with other items to put in the boxes and also help to provide a donation for shipping costs. The donation of items to put in the boxes was also appreciated. We will also be sending \$500 to Samaritan's purse to help with shipping costs. We had a great group of people that helped to set up the packing party and also another great group of people that helped to pack the boxes and are very appreciative of their time to help out.

Rick and Dianne Dalrymple took our food donations that have been collected over the last couple of months to the Manna Food Pantry.

The Education Team shared that three youth who hadn't been attending Sunday school who have returned! Praise God for that news! We are grateful to our Sunday School teachers - Amber Nielsen has been teaching this fall. Pam Soderholm is currently teaching the next section. Pastor Daren and Sherry Benton are leading confirmation once again this year, with 3 students from First and 3 from Adrian meeting once a month on a Saturday. The Monday morning women's Bible study has ended with about 12 to 15 attending. The women's advent Bible study is set to begin soon. Pastor Daren's November Bible study has had about 7-8 persons each week.

Gretchen O'Donnell shared that the craft nights have been well attended. Last week there were nine people from The Meadows and a several from Adrian UMC. The Thankfulness calendars and the gratitude pumpkins have been in use for the past few weeks. She also shared that we have participated with First Lutheran on an outreach night in Iowa. She also reported that the Trunk or Treat event with First Lutheran had about 100 kids participating, with nine cars showing up.

The annual holiday parade has been shelved due to weather concerns - an indoor gathering for families will be held at the JBS facility instead. Gretchen shared that the youth did meals for Wednesday night's C3. To date, the Wednesday Night meals have taken in about \$1000 while paying \$1500 for the meals. First Church hosted the Worthington Area Youth Ministers Association last month.

The Friendship Club was a blast! We thank everyone for their contributions and volunteering. Special thanks to the Night Lights Circle for organizing this event and to John Steinle for calling the Bingo numbers!

The annual Polka service was held in October and was well attended. That Sunday the Southern Prairie Rev. Dr. Woojae Im preached and then met with church leaders from both congregations, helping them to gain a clearer understanding of what we are looking for in a new pastor.

Rick, Pat Grimmius, John, and Gretchen encouraged everyone to join in for the Fresh Expressions workshop at First UMC on Saturday, December 2nd from 9:00 a.m. to noon on Zoom.

Jim Nickel shared that the Trustees met with Ameriprise last week and learned that their investments were doing well. Pastor Daren expressed appreciation for those who assisted in helping him move some belongings to their new home in Rochester.

#### **Challenges:**

The Council discussed the constant moving of chairs and tables in the Fellowship Hall, wondering if something could not be done to help the Hispanic Church. Pastor Daren will talk with them next week.

Gretchen shared that they are still working on marking the doors with numbers. It is also taking a while to form a team of people to monitor the sanctuary doors after worship has begun.

#### **Current Focus:**

Pam shared that the Missions Team has received a good amount of monetary donations for the Winter Clothing for Prairie Elementary. The Team will be checking with them to see what their current needs are and will collaborate with them throughout the cold months. We also continue to collect warm winter clothing for the Love INC gap ministry Clothes Closet at First Lutheran Church. Winter boots (especially kids winter boots) are needed. The Missions Team is planning to do the Souper Bowl Soup Cook-off on Sunday, January 28th. More details will be given in the near future. Lastly, the Missions Team reported that they were disbursing funds to Linda Doeden, Every Meal, MN West Pop-up Food Pantry. and Morning Star. They are grateful for the Foundation's yearly contribution along with other individual contributions throughout the year.

The Trustees shared that they will be looking into the issue of the parsonage for new pastor in July of 2024. They will be looking at all avenues from providing a parsonage or a housing allowance. Jim also shared that insurance costs are rising. He is working on a possible change for lower costs but less coverage.

Gretchen shared the following Advent Christmas events: the reverse advent calendar will be printed again this year, which suggests daily items you can give each day of Lent. C3 will decorate the church on Wednesday, November 29th right after the meal. The Sunday School program is scheduled for December 10th. The annual Cookie Walk has been moved to a Wednesday (December 13th) and the proceeds from the sale of the cookies will be donated to the CETA church for purchasing gifts for children. Motion made to commit proceeds to CETA church for Christmas gifts for children and whatever is done with any leftover funds is up to them. Motion second and carried.

Our yearly Christmas Caroling outing will be on Sunday, December 17th - more information later on this. We usually do to some of our home bound members and the area care centers. Christmas eve services will be held on the afternoon of Sunday, December 24th (normal Sunday services will also be at the same time that Sunday). C3 will undecorate the church on January 10th.

First Church will host Youth 507 group in February. In addition, the Community Kids Camp is working toward next year's event.

Gretchen shared three items:

1) There is a Youth Leadership Seminar in Chandler that she is planning on attending next year.
