Numbers Are Up!

As our Street Reach teams venture out each week, we are encountering more neighbors in various circumstances on our streets. Some have set up camp by the river, forming their own community; many newcomers are residing in vehicles parked around town; Fish and Game has reached out for our assistance with families in the Mink Creek area; and there are always a few individuals spending time in the alcove at Valley Mission during the day.

National Context

We are not alone in witnessing a rise in the number of people living on the streets. Across the nation, the average increase in homelessness stands at approximately 12%. This is in addition to a 15% rise in homelessness in 2024. Many individuals experiencing homelessness are doing so for the first time, and the number of families facing homelessness is also growing.

Community Initiative

Valley Mission will collaborate with other agencies and community leaders to launch a campaign aimed at educating our valley about this pressing issue. The more we comprehend the situation affecting us, the better equipped we will be to draft a plan that provides real, tangible support for all those affected.

Current Funding Situation: A Candid Update

While I don't want to be a 'Debbie Downer,' I must share that our financial situation is quite tight at the moment. Although our funding streams are in the works, there hasn't been any recent progress on grants and other requests.

- This delay largely stems from the financial uncertainties affecting many of our foundations and supporters.
- There are numerous unknowns, leading to a lot of 'wait and see' responses, which we completely understand!

Rest assured, our services will NOT be impacted by this slowdown. The only aspect facing delays will be construction as we await additional funds for the next phase. However, we have some good news: we are nearing completion on our bids for the sprinklers!



We continue to gather the necessary bids for the sprinkler system. Please pray that both bids will come in sooner than later. We have one in now, but this second one is taking more time than we anticipated.



Pantry Bites...

- Gardens are starting to produce good food right now. If you have extra, or know a neighbor who has extra, please bring them to the food pantry on Wednesday before 11 am. Fresh produce is one of the best items we can provide for our guests. We cannot take any items that have been processed, such as jams, jelly, sauces, salsa, etc.
 Only fresh, whole fruits and vegetables.
- PROTEIN! We are always looking for items such as tuna fish, peanut butter, and other protein items to add to our food boxes. And if the product has a easy open top on it, that helps our homeless population a ton. Pouches of tuna are another great example of protein that we can use.
