Our revamped outreach is coming in June!
Reach Access Mobile Partnerships - RAMP - is an extension of our Street Reach ministries. We invite those in need to a central location where they can connect with resources, supplies, medical care and more.

Joining us this year will be the Free Clinic, Dr. Nan's Veterinary services, The Rock Church (clothing), Southeast Idaho Dept. of Health, Center for Hope South, VA Services, and more. We are meeting at Union Pacific Park, behind the Whitman building and the Post Office downtown, every third Wednesday from 11 am until 1 pm. This is a great way to earn trust of the homeless community and show them that there are many resources available, as well as people who truly desire to help.

Construction Progress

Making Headway...

- We have finally begun to work on fire sprinkler bids with 2 companies. It has been an experience getting to this point. One of the companies actually has a crew ready to get to work as soon as permits and plans are ready to go. This is huge!
- Since it has taken so long to get to this point with the fire sprinklers, our costs have now gone up substantially. Bids are coming in between \$125,000 and \$150,000.
- The curbs are poured out in front of the building that will define planter boxes and sidewalk space. We are trying to get the front 'cleaned up' so the community can see we are making progress. Every little detail and step counts!



We have had the opportunity to request funding from both the County Commissioners and the Pocatello City Council. Both of these requests will be for fall funding, if approved.

Please continue to pray that both groups get behind our project and see the incredible benefits that it will have on those going through the program and the impact on the community.



Pantry Bites...

- Here comes summer! And the most often asked question is 'Can I bring my garden produce to the Food Pantry?'
 The answer is YES! We love fresh produce, especially home-grown produce. Items must be whole and not processed in any way. We are not able to accept any jams, jellies, salsa, etc. that have been canned at home.
- While we are on gardening, if you have room IN your garden to plant an extra row of something, would you consider doing so and donating that to the Food Pantry? Again, fresh produce is a much better offering than canned or processed items.
