Warming Shelter Winter Plans

Is it really only the beginning of September, and we're already discussing winter? to be effective, we must start planning well in advance for the upcoming season. We recently learned that one of the shelters will not be opening this year. We are concerned about our neighbors who will be on the streets during these frigid months. Aid for Friends will likely be at capacity most of the time, leaving many vulnerable to severe conditions, or forcing them to make unwise choices just to stay warm.

Valley Mission is working diligently to open the Food Pantry in our new space before winter, allowing the existing pantry space to be transformed into a warming shelter. This initiative requires careful planning and many helping hands to be successful for our community. Please be aware that this is still a work in progress, so we ask for your patience. More details will be available in the coming weeks.



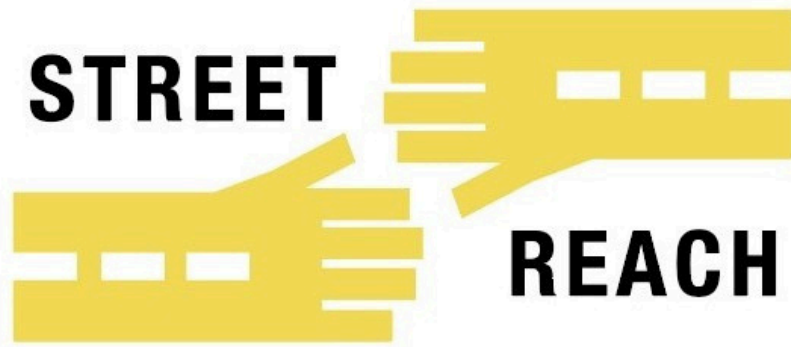
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Year to date, we have identified 91 (unduplicated) individuals living on our streets. More work to be done!

We're joining a national conversation around homelessness.

On October 9-10, Valley Mission director, Karl Pettit, will sit on a bench – rain, snow, or shine – for 24 hours to listen, talk, and share with our community.

It's part of Conversations on A Bench, a Citygate Network event taking place in dozens of cities across North America. The goal? To reflect the love of God and create space for honest conversations about homelessness, addiction, and mental health. We're hopeful this event helps shift hearts and spread the hope of Christ in our city.

One Bite At A Time...

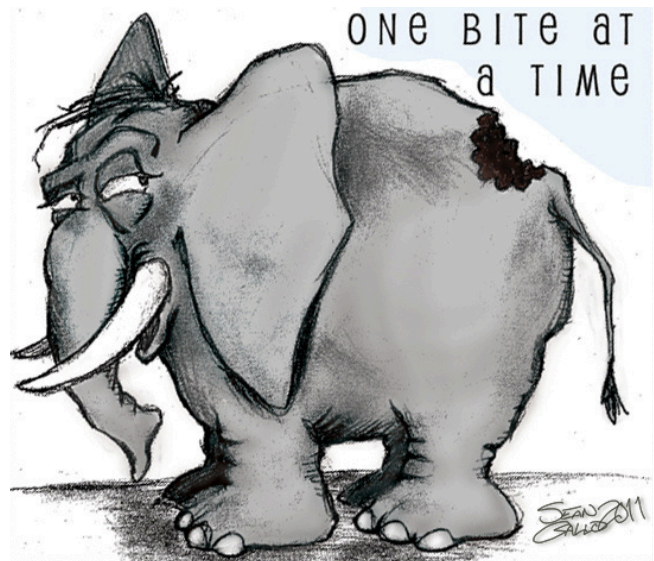
How Do You Eat an Elephant? One Bite at a Time (Please note, we're not suggesting anyone actually eat an elephant.)

We have a significant task ahead of us: raising \$140,000 to get the sprinkler system installed. That figure can feel daunting for many of us! However, if I said it would take roughly \$3,500 per day to complete the task, that seems to be a more manageable number for some of us. The project will take approximately 8 weeks to complete, which equates to \$3,500 per day.

We're reaching out to our supporters to assist us in raising these funds as quickly as possible, bringing us closer to our goal of opening the food pantry at its new location. This will have a domino effect, allowing our current pantry location to serve as a warming shelter during the cold months ahead—almost a “two-for-one” impact.

Food is delivered from our 14 stores as well as from the Idaho Foodbank. Unloading, sorting, organizing and building food boxes takes place on this day.

Thursdays, 10 am to 11 am

Additional food deliveries from some of the same stores. Unloading, sorting and organizing takes place here.

Thursdays, 3:30 to 6 pm

Food is distributed to the community. Most 'jobs' deal with serving the guest as well as carrying boxes to their vehicles.
