• The kids were saddened to see their friend Adam hurt by his parents' divorce. He was also the victim of his dad's selfish behavior. The pain he felt was not his fault. Adam was simply trapped in the middle of someone else's sinful choices.

Because of the misery that sin causes, Bonnie reminds the kids to act differently. The Bible, she says, teaches, "Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good." (Romans 12:21)



Solve the Mystery...Today's adventure was full of lessons that teach us how to come closer to Jesus and live by His Word. Here are 3 discussion topics that will help connect the story to your daily life:

- 1. Adam said he missed the times when his family was all together. Can you relate to his sadness? Or do you know someone who can? Psalm 68:5-6 says, "A father to the fatherless, a defender of widows, is God in his holy dwelling. God sets the lonely in families, he leads out the prisoners with singing;" What does this verse mean? And how can it comfort you or someone you know whose family is divided?
- 2. Adam's dad acted selfishly in trying to steal his son from his mother. How do you know when something you want to do is selfish? And what about the lesson we learned today can help you choose <u>not</u> to act selfishly?



Grow Your Faith...This episode has the themes of fear, life after death, and knowing the Truth. Let's say a prayer, asking that God would guide us through our daily lives as we strive to take these themes to heart:

Dear God, you know that family looks very different for everyone, and it can often be difficult. But I thank you that you care for me more than anyone else could. You want to teach my dad and mom just like you want to teach me, so help me to love them. And help me to not be selfish, but to trust you because you will help me even when I'm hurting.
