In Today's Episode...

As the Clu Crew settle into their lives in Chicago, they discover the difficulty of making friends in new places and quickly find themselves wrapped up in a fiery mystery that has them searching the building for suspects.



Follow the Clues...

Alongside every exciting mystery, the Clu Crew grow in their faith by discovering the truths inside Scripture. Did you spot the Bible verses they used to solve personal puzzles?

- As the Clu Crew discusses the difficulty of making friends in new places, Bonnie reminds them that that the ideal friend "loves at all times." (Proverbs 17:17)
- When the Clu Crew chews over the suspects, Peter recalls Proverbs 13:20 which states that "Whoever walks with the wise becomes wise, but the companion of fools will suffer harm."
- At the end of the episode, the Clu Crew reflects on the recent loss of their parents. Bonnie and Peter remember that even "Jesus wept" when he lost someone close to Him (John 11:35).



Solve the Mystery...

Today's adventure was full of lessons that teach us how to come closer to Jesus and live by His Word. Here are 3 discussion topics that will help connect the story to your daily life:

1. Before the Clu Crew begin their investigation, Peter mentions that they should "pray first." Why is it important to pray before taking on a challenging task?

2. When Bobby almost loses hope, Peter helps him by saying that they "will keep on trusting God to guide us." When was the last time you felt like you were losing hope? When you next feel that way, what can you do regain hope?

3. After the Clu Crew solves the mystery, Uncle Chuck decides to drop some charges against Mortimer. Have you ever forgiven someone when they have wronged you?



Grow Your Faith...

This episode has themes of prayer, friendship, and confession. Let's say a prayer, asking that God would guide us through our daily lives as we strive to take these themes to heart:

"Dear God: when loss comes into our lives, comfort us and let us know that it is okay to be sad as you are sad along with us. When we are challenged, remind us to pray for your perfect wisdom. And strengthen us to forgive those who have wronged us, as you forgive your children who have wronged you. Amen."
