NEW LIFE TIMELINE

1946

Our first building project begins on a downtown lot. Early leaders, including Rev. Raymond Bache and Rev. Fred Dalton, helped complete construction and

launch the ministry in the heart of the city.



1978

A new identity was embraced as Polson Assembly of God became New Life Christian Center. The church was built on the top of a hill, the very site where we still gather today, which the congregation fondly referred to as 'a city on a hill,' inspired by Jesus' words in Matthew 5:14.



Pastor Shawn and Christina Madsen shepherded the church through fruitful ministry seasons, particularly by expanding the Catalyst Youth Ministry. Under the mission of making and mobilizing disciples for Christ, they brought strong pastoral care, steady leadership, and a deep commitment to the spiritual growth of the church family.

2020-2024

In 2020 we celebrated 75 years of ministry and embraced a fresh focus: shifting from traditional membership to intentional discipleship, empowering fivefold gifts, and cultivating a culture of Spirit-led growth. This season brings a renewed hunger to seek, discern, and boldly step into the activity of God.

The Bus Ministry is launched, bringing children and families to church. The Connect Track is introduced, helping people discover their fivefold giftings in both their personal lives and in the life of the church.

known as New Life Church.

The Kids Ministry space was renovated, the Wood Ministry launched, and we continued to make the love of Jesus visible in word and deed.

\$1 MILLION

READY FOR MORE REACH

\$100 THOUSAND

It's not about growing a crowd; it's about reaching the people Jesus died to save.

God has called us to reach the lost, welcome the searching, and bring the hope of Jesus to our neighbors and the nations. That's why this next season includes strategic investment in outreach, evangelism, and missions, both locally and around the world.

Over the next two years, we're setting aside \$100,000 to expand our reach and open the door for more people to encounter Jesus.

"Go and make disciples of all the nations..." Matthew 28:19 (NLT)

This investment will help us:

- Launch targeted outreach campaigns and community invites
- Fund and expand local outreach
- Support global missionaries and church plants
- Pursue intentional outreach to First Nations people
- Engage the unchurched and spiritually disconnected across the Mission Valley and beyond





READY FOR MORE IMPACT

*The total cost for this project is \$1.9 million. With \$300k already set aside in savings, our goal is to raise the remaining \$1.6 million through Ready for More to bring this vision to life.

\$1.6 MILLION*

It's not that we need more space "yet"; it's that our current space isn't meeting the needs of today's ministries.

Right now, key areas are outdated, inaccessible, or underutilized. If we want to welcome more people, disciple more families, and host more ministry effectively, we need to reimagine what we already have so that every square foot advances the mission.

That's why \$1.6 million of this initiative will go toward strategic facility upgrades that remove barriers and make space for life-changing encounters with God.

This investment will help us:

- Open up new entryways that welcome people in and remove physical barriers
- Create warm, functional hospitality areas through a refreshed kitchen and bathrooms
- Transform our Connect Room into a hub for next steps and deeper relationships
- Improve signage and flow so guests feel seen, not lost
- Make space for the next generation with updated rooms for kids, youth, and discipleship













EXPLANATION OF THE

ONE FUND APPROACH

Instead of giving to separate buckets, this is a One Fund initiative.

That means every dollar given over the next two years, whether it's your regular tithe, a one-time gift, or a faith-stretching offering, goes to fuel the entire mission of New Life Church.

Rather than dividing gifts between a ministry fund, an outreach fund, and a building fund, we're keeping it simple:

One Fund that supports everything God is doing.

GROWING IN FAITH, ONE STEP AT A TIME

We believe generosity is a spiritual journey, not a financial transaction.

Wherever you are right now, the goal isn't comparison; it's obedience. As we take steps of faith together, we grow not only in what we give, but also in how we trust.

INITIAL GIVER

"I'm taking my first step of faith."

This is where the journey begins, choosing to trust God by giving something, even if it's small.

CONSISTENT GIVER

"I give first not last - consistently trusting God with every season"

You've decided to give regularly, week by week, month by month, as a pattern of discipleship.

INTENTIONAL GIVER

"I budget generosity into my life because God comes first, not last."

You give with purpose, often using a percentage of your income. You're giving to God first, not last.

SURRENDERED GIVER

"I ask God what He wants, not just what feels safe.."

This step is about radical trust, letting God set the amount.

LIFETIME GIVER

"Generosity isn't something I do, it's who I am."

You see everything you have, money, time, relationships, as a tool for Kingdom impact. Giving isn't something you do; it's who you are.

CREATIVE WAYS TO GIVE

STRETCHING YOUR FAITH, NOT JUST YOUR FINANCES

Generosity doesn't always start with your bank account. Sometimes it starts with small sacrifices, reworked priorities, or delayed comforts.

As you pray about your commitment, consider what faith-filled giving could look like in your everyday life.

LIFESTYLE ADJUSTMENTS

- Pause or cancel subscriptions for a season
- Eat out less often and give what you save
- Skip the coffee run and save the change
- Postpone a big purchase or vacation
- Share a vehicle and save on gas and insurance
- Set aside tax refunds or bonuses as seed for impact

FAMILY-BASED IDEAS

- Involve your kids by collecting coins in a "Giving Jar"
- Skip a gift exchange and give the total
- Give birthday or Christmas money toward your commitment
- Fast from something together and talk about what it means to give it up for something greater

STORED RESOURCES

"Don't store up treasures here on earth... Store your treasures in heaven..." — Matthew 6:19-20 (NLT)

- Sell unused items or extra gear and donate the profit
- Redirect side hustle income for the next 2 years
- Use your skills (photography, design, baking, etc.) to raise support
- Give assets (stock, property, savings) for lasting Kingdom impact
- Add New Life to your will for future generations' support

A JOURNEY OF OBEDIENCE, NOT OBLIGATION

We're asking every person in our New Life family to seek God and say "yes" to whatever He's asking. It's not just a financial step; it's a spiritual one.

So, what does that look like?

Here are four ways you can actively engage in this journey—personally, prayerfully, and wholeheartedly:

PRAY FERVENTLY

Ask God to move powerfully in your life and the life of our church. Invite the Holy Spirit to stir your heart and lead you to trust Him more deeply.

"Devote yourselves to prayer with an alert mind and a thankful heart." — Colossians 4:2 (NLT)

COMMIT FULLY

Step off the sidelines and into the story. We're believing for 100% engagement, every person using their gifts, giving generously, and growing in faith.

GROW INTENTIONALLY

Discipleship means movement. Ask God where He's stretching your trust, challenging your comfort, or inviting you to lead. We grow stronger when we grow together.

GIVE SACRIFICIALLY

This is more than a financial decision; it's a surrender decision. Ask God to lead you in faith-filled generosity. Let your giving reflect your dependence on Him and your devotion to His mission.

What is "Ready for More"?

It's a two-year discipleship journey to prepare our church spiritually, financially, and practically for all God is calling us into. It includes deepening our prayer life, stepping out in generosity, and making our building more usable and welcoming.

What is a One Fund initiative?

Instead of giving to separate funds (building, missions, general), everything we give over the next two years will go into one unified **Ready for More** fund. This allows us to fully support daily ministry, local and global outreach, and facility upgrades all at once.

What should I include in my commitment?

We're asking you to pray and include all giving over the next two years: your regular tithes, any expanded giving, and any special gifts God leads you to give. Your total commitment represents your full generosity journey for this season.



WEEK ONE

I'M IN: THE CALL TO OBEDIENCE

September 14-20

"The Lord had said to Abram, 'Leave your native country, your relatives, and your father's family, and go to the land that I will show you."

THINK ABOUT IT

Obedience often starts with a simple yes, before you have the full picture. That's what happened with Abram. God gave him a direction, not a destination. No details, no roadmap. Just, "Go." And Abram went. Real obedience doesn't wait for clarity; it responds with trust. Saying yes to God might not always make sense at the start, but it always leads to more than we could imagine.

WEEKLY INVITATION

Is there something God's been prompting you to do, but you've been holding back, waiting for more details or better timing? This week, lean into the truth that obedience is the starting point for every journey with God. **You don't have to know where the road leads, only who's leading**. Your "yes" today opens the door for His promises tomorrow.

BRING IT TO THE LORD

ASK THE HOLY SPIRIT

- Where am I hesitating to obey You?
- What's one area where You're asking me to take a step, before I see the outcome?

PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

Father, help me to trust You like Abram did. I may not know where You're taking me, but I believe You're faithful. I choose to say "yes", even when it's hard. Grow my faith and lead me, step by step. Amen.

PUTTING IT INTO PRACTICE

Set aside 10 minutes to reread Genesis 12:1-4 and ask: What's God callir leave behind?	ng me to
Make a list of areas where obedience feels risky and write one step you o	can take in each.

Memorize Matthew 6:33 (NLT) as a reminder to seek God first, even when the path is unclear.

"Seek the Kingdom of God above all else, and live righteously, and he will give you everything you need."







GENESIS 15:5-6 (NLT)

"Then the Lord took Abram outside and said to him, 'Look up into the sky and count the stars if you can. That's how many descendants you will have!' And Abram believed the Lord, and the Lord counted him as righteous because of his faith."

THINK ABOUT IT

Waiting on God is rarely easy. When the promise feels distant and the timeline unclear, our minds fill in the gaps with fear, doubt, or the need for control. Abram and Sarai knew that struggle. Years passed between promise and fulfillment, and still, they were asked to trust. Trust doesn't mean you never question. It means you keep walking with God even when the road is foggy and the results feel far away.

WEEKLY INVITATION

This week, take a closer look at where you've been wrestling with God's timing. What if the waiting isn't punishment, it's preparation? What if the silence isn't God ignoring you, it's Him building something deeper in you? The truth is, God never fails His promises, but He often stretches our faith. Instead of trying to take control, try laying it down. Let trust replace your timeline.

BRING IT TO THE LORD

ASK THE HOLY SPIRIT

- Where am I struggling to trust You right now?
- Have I been holding onto fear or control more than faith?

PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

God, I admit, it's hard to trust when I don't see answers. But I know You're good. Teach me to wait on You with patience, not panic. Help me surrender control and rest in the truth that You are always faithful. Amen.

PUTTING IT INTO PRACTICE

Read Luke 12:22-34 (NLT) and ask God to shift your focus from worry to worship.
Write out one promise from Scripture you're clinging to in this season.
Share with a trusted friend or mentor where you're learning to trust God more deeply.

NOTES





PROVERBS 3:9-10 (NLT)

"Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the best part of everything you produce. Then he will fill your barns with grain, and your vats will overflow with good wine."

THINK ABOUT IT

We all have priorities, but not all priorities are equal. God doesn't just ask to be on our list; He asks to be first on it. When He's first, everything else finds its right place. But when something else takes that top spot, whether it's money, success, comfort, or control, it shapes our decisions and steals our peace. Giving God the first doesn't just honor Him, it realigns us.

WEEKLY INVITATION

This isn't just about money. It's about trust. It's about surrender. It's about whether or not God truly has first place in your life. In Scripture, the "principle of the first" shows up repeatedly; **God blesses what's brought to Him first**. So, this week, ask yourself: In my finances, my time, and decisions, is God first? And if not, what needs to shift?

BRING IT TO THE LORD

ASK THE HOLY SPIRIT

- What have I been putting before God, maybe without realizing it?
- · Where do I need to trust Him more and put Him first again?

PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

God, You deserve first place in every part of my life. Show me where I've let other things take Your place. Teach me to put You first, not just in words, but in action, in attitude, and in every decision. Amen.

PUTTING IT INTO PRACTICE

Read Genesis 13 and notice how Abraham honored God above personal gain. Set aside your first 10 minutes each morning to be with God, no phone, no distractions. Reflect on one area (finances, schedule, relationships) where God is asking to be first and take a step toward surrender.









2 CORINTHIANS 9:7-8 (NLT)

"You must each decide in your heart how much to give. And don't give reluctantly or in response to pressure. 'For God loves a person who gives cheerfully.' And God will generously provide all you need..."

THINK ABOUT IT

Generosity isn't just about giving, it's about joy. Have you ever given someone a gift they weren't expecting, and watched their face light up? That moment changes both of you. God designed generosity not as a burden, but as a blessing, one that sets us free from fear and scarcity. It's not about how much you give; it's about the heart behind it.

WEEKLY INVITATION

Kingdom generosity is upside-down. It doesn't come from having more; it comes from trusting God with what you already have. This week, consider: Is your giving rooted in joy or driven by obligation? **Scarcity says, "There's not enough." Faith says, "God will provide."** When we give with open hands, we reflect the generous heart of our Father, and joy follows.

BRING IT TO THE LORD

ASK THE HOLY SPIRIT

- Have I been holding back in any area where You're calling me to give freely?
- What does cheerful, Spirit-led generosity look like for me this week?

PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

Father, You've given so much to me, more than I deserve. Help me live with open hands and a joyful heart. Teach me to give like You give, freely, cheerfully, and with faith that You'll always provide. Amen.

GENESIS 22:2 (NLT)

"'Take your son, your only son—yes, Isaac, whom you love so much—and go to the land of Moriah. Go and sacrifice him as a burnt offering on one of the mountains, which I will show you."

THINK ABOUT IT

This is one of the most gut-wrenching moments in Scripture. God asks Abraham to lay down what he loves most—his promised son. It wasn't about cruelty. It was about trust. Would Abraham still believe in the promise if he had to release the thing that represented it? **Sometimes, God asks us to lay something down not because He wants to take it, but because He wants to know if He has our hearts first.**

WEEKLY INVITATION

What's your "Isaac"? What's the thing you've been clinging to that God might be asking you to place on the altar? It could be a dream, a plan, a comfort, or even control itself. God rarely pries things from our hands; He invites us to trust Him enough to let go. And when we do, we find that what He gives back is always better, deeper, and more lasting than what we give up.

BRING IT TO THE LORD

ASK THE HOLY SPIRIT

- Is there something You're asking me to surrender that I've been holding tightly?
- What would it look like for me to lay it down in faith?

PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

Lord, You know what I'm holding onto. Give me the courage to release what I cannot control and to trust You fully. Even when it's costly, I choose to obey You because I know You are faithful and good. Amen.

PUTTING IT INTO PRACTICE

Read Luke 18:18-30 and reflect on the rich young ruler's struggle to let go.

Write a letter with it.	to God naming what you're laying down—and what you're trusting Him to	do

Take one bold step of surrender this week, even if it feels small. God sees it.







ROMANS 12:1 (NLT)

"And so, dear brothers and sisters, I plead with you to give your bodies to God because of all He has done for you. Let them be a living and holy sacrifice—the kind he will find acceptable. This is truly the way to worship him."

THINK ABOUT IT

Some things are easy to surrender, others feel too personal, too painful, or too deeply embedded in our routines. But true surrender means there's nothing off-limits. No hidden corners. No "God, You can have this... but not that." Paul calls us to be "living sacrifices," not just laying something down once, but daily choosing to live fully yielded to God in every area.

WEEKLY INVITATION

This week is about discipleship on a deeper level. Not just what you give, but how you live. It's a call to bring every part of your life: your habits, your priorities, your finances, your identity, under the Lordship of Jesus. **When you stop compartmentalizing your faith, you'll start seeing transformation in every area**. Jesus doesn't want to be an accessory; He wants to be the center.

BRING IT TO THE LORD

ASK THE HOLY SPIRIT

- Is there any area of my life I've been keeping separate from my faith?
- What does true surrender look like in my everyday decisions?

PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

Jesus, I don't want to hold anything back. Every part of me belongs to You. Teach me to live with nothing off-limits. Make my life a daily act of worship, holy, surrendered, and fully Yours. Amen.

PUTTING IT INTO PRACTICE

Read Philippians 3:7-8 and reflect on what Paul gave up for the sake of Christ.	
Do an honest inventory of your life, time, money, speech, and relationships. Ask: Is Jesus Lord here?	
Choose one area where you've held back and make a shift to surrender it more fully this week.

1 CHRONICLES 29:14 (NLT)

"But who am I, and who are my people, that we could give anything to you? Everything we have has come from you, and we give you only what you first gave us!"

THINK ABOUT IT

When David and the people of Israel gave toward the building of the temple, it wasn't under pressure; it was with joy, unity, and faith. Their giving wasn't just financial; it was deeply personal. It was their way of saying, "God, You're worth it. This is our yes." Every step of obedience in your life is a response to God's invitation. And every "yes" makes room for His purpose to unfold.

WEEKLY INVITATION

You're part of something bigger than yourself. As we step forward together in faith, this isn't just about what you give; it's about how we move as one body. **When each person brings their "yes", God multiplies the impact**. This week is about prayerful, joyful commitment. Not just writing something down, but saying from the heart: "God, I'm **Ready for More**."

BRING IT TO THE LORD

ASK THE HOLY SPIRIT

- What does my personal "yes" to God look like in this season?
- · How can my faith contribute to the unity and mission of our church family?

PRAYER FOR THE WEEK

God, everything I have is a gift from You. I want to say "yes", not out of pressure, but out of love and faith. Help me give joyfully and trust completely. Use my life to build something eternal. Amen.

PUTTING IT INTO PRACTICE

Read 2 Corinthians 9:6-8 and ask God to shape your heart toward cheerful giving.

Take time this week to prayerfully write down your "yes," whether in finances, service, or surrender.

Encourage someone else in your church family as they take their next step, too. Unity grows when we walk in faith together.

ACTS 4:32 (NLT)

"All the believers were united in heart and mind. And they felt that what they owned was not their own, so they shared everything they had."

THINK ABOUT IT

Read 1 Peter 3:8 and Colossians 3:14. Ask God to increase your love for your church family. Share a testimony or story of how God has moved during this season, as your voice strengthens others.

Look for a way to link arms with someone this week—serve, pray, or encourage them as part of the team.

Maybe you were encouraged, challenged, or discovered places that still needed surrender. That's part of the journey, and it's a journey worth staying on.


Because here's the truth: your "yes" still matters. And the impact multiplies when we walk in unity, faith, and obedience as a church family.
