STUDENT PASTOR

HOW DID YOU COME INTO A RELATIONSHIP WITH CHRIST?

When I was about 5 years old my dad's uncle passed away. I attended the funeral with my parents. I began to have questions about life, death, God, eternity and so on. That night, as I laid in bed trying to fall asleep, I was still thinking through these questions. In that moment, I felt God's presence for the first time. I didn't have all the answers to my questions or understand how deeply I needed God, but I realized that I needed Him. I prayed, gave my life to Him, and asked Him to forgive me of my sins.

DESCRIBE IN DETAIL WHAT YOUR VISION FOR STUDENT MINISTRY MIGHT LOOK AT FBC?

Any portion of ministry done by the Church should be about making disciples who make disciples. Student ministry is no different. Youth ministry should be a funnel that brings students in and is a safe place for them to find and explore faith. Once they are in the door and have found that they have a desire to pursue Jesus, we should have opportunities for students to grow in and explore their faith (I.e. small groups, mentorship, study tools, conferences, camps etc.). The end goal is to take them from disciples of Jesus to disciple makers.

DESCRIBE YOUR CALL TO MINISTRY AND WHAT MOTIVATES YOU TO STAY IN MINISTRY?

I knew I was called to ministry pretty early on. My dad was a student pastor, so I spent lots of time in church and saw the ins and outs of ministry life. I believed that I was supposed to be in ministry but by high school I had somewhat forgotten how I had been drawn to ministry. In college, I wanted to study art and design. Halfway through my second year at SBU, in the middle of my Christmas break, I was sitting in a Sunday evening service at my home church. As I was listening to the pastor preach I sensed God's presence. In that moment, I felt that God was making clear to me the path He wanted me to pursue. At the end of the service, I went forward and surrendered my life

to serve God in the ministry of the Church.

Motivation to remain in ministry has to be from God. There are seasons I feel self motivated and driven to do the work, but there are seasons that are draining and I feel unmotivated. What keeps me steady in pursuit of my calling is reminding myself that it is for God's purpose, not my own that I am serving. Going back to the gospel and being reminded of what I have been saved from, but also what I've been saved into is a strong motivator. We have been saved from sin, but we have all saved into the body of Christ. As followers of Jesus, we are all called to the work of seeking and saving the lost and have been equipped by Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit to do this work.
