

LIFE TRIVIA:

- Which three progressive actions does Psalm 1 identify as the path the blessed man refuses to take, and what does this progression reveal about the nature of compromise?
- In Psalm 2, what is God's response to the rage of nations, and what does this reveal about heaven's perspective on earthly rebellion?
- In Psalm 3, what three roles does David assign to God in the midst of threat, and how do these roles redefine victory?
- Across Psalms 4–7, what repeated request does David make that connects righteousness with God's response, and why is this significant for prayer?

David repeatedly asks God to hear him, to judge righteously—showing that confidence in prayer is rooted in alignment, not in merit. Psalms 1:1–3 — shield, glory, and utter of the head, victory is protection, honor, and restoration. Psalms 4:1–8 — God laughs, revealing divine sovereignty and the futility of resistance against His authority. Psalms 5:1–12 — walking, standing, sitting, compromise deepens through posture before it manifests in behavior. Psalms 6:1–10 — walking, standing, sitting, compromise deepens through posture before it manifests in behavior.

FRIDAY

I decree that my mind, body, and purpose operate under heaven's victory and remain untouched by defeat. (Romans 12:2; 3 John 1:2)

SATURDAY

By the authority of Jesus Christ, I enforce peace, order, and dominion in every area of my life. (Isaiah 54:17; 1 Corinthians 15:57)
