## January Chapel


During the months of November and December, we collected \$239.69 for The Coat Closet. The offerings for the month of January will go to Lutheran Hour Ministries.


## Lunch & Tuition Bills

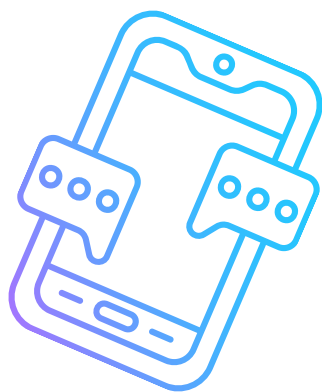




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## School Closing Information

## Parent Vist Day

Parents are always welcome at St. Paul's, but on February 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> our annual parent visitation days will be held. 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## Standard Response Protocol

As part of our Teacher In-Service we did a refresher course on SRP (Standard Response Protocol) is based on an all-hazards approach as opposed to individual scenarios. Like the Incident Command System (ICS), SRP utilizes clear common language while allowing for flexibility in protocol.

The premise is simple - there are five specific actions that can be performed during an incident. When communicating these, the action is labeled with a "Term of Art" and is then followed by a "Directive." Execution of the action is performed by active participants, including students, staff, teachers and first responders. The SRP is based on the following actions: Hold, Secure, Lockdown, Evacuate, and Shelter.
