HUMBLING EXPERIENCES IN LANGUAGE LEARNING

Greetings from Albertville! We've been here about six months now, and the time has flown by! Matthias' theology studies are continuing to progress well, and I'm now in my second semester of language school. Between formal classes, a knitting club at a nearby café, and regular meetings with a local language partner—along with lots of help from my built-in language partner, Matthias—my French is coming along.

I'm at a funny stage in language learning right now where I understand *most* of what I hear, but I can't quite express *most* of what I want to say, at least not in the way I'd like to. On the one hand, that's only natural—think of how soon kids begin to understand, and how long it takes them to speak without making funny mistakes! In that sense, it's not a bad thing to be feeling like a kid, still absorbing way more than I'm expressing and relying heavily on people's patience and help. It's just humbling, in a good way. But on the other hand, feeling like a child learning how to talk can be frustrating and embarrassing, and it's sometimes tempting to hide behind my own sense of insufficiency, to settle into fly-on-the-wall mode and only speak when I absolutely have to. Besides having the potential to be detrimental to my own progress, that's also just not conducive to meaningful conversations and real relationships, and,



ultimately, to sharing the gospel.

As I'm gradually learning how to express myself in French, I'm increasingly aware that there's a time to be quiet, to learn, to absorb, and a time to start to speak, to share, to pour out. As our move to Chad approaches and this transitional season between preparation and full-time ministry draws to a

close, I find myself reflecting that as with language learning, so with Christian life in general: at no point on this side of the sun does learning and growing stop; at no point will I cease to need pouring into; at no point should I graduate from being a "little child" to whom Christ's Kingdom belongs (Mt 18:3). Yet, we're called to maturity, to be students who don't just store up knowledge, but go on to share it (Heb 5:12). We're not meant to just be flies on the wall—we're the salt and light of the earth (Mt 5:13-16)!

Matthias and I are here because we long to shine Christ's light, wherever we are, in whatever season. Please pray for us, that in our studies and all other aspects of our lives, we would be both humble and bold to live out our missionary calling, for the sake of Christ's Kingdom throughout the Earth.
