I. CHRISTIAN TESTIMONY

III. PERSONAL QUALIFICATIONS

- Her family and personal life must evidence stability and reasonable maturity.
- She must be a team player who works well under authority and aligns with the Discipleship Ministry Team Playbook.
- She should be a gatherer, hospitable, community-centered, and evidence an uncommon zeal for women's evangelism and discipleship

IV. GENERAL DUTIES:

The ADYP will report to the Director of Young Professionals, and her duties will be generally related to but not specifically bound to the following:

• Evangelism

- To be strategic in creating and implementing "Go and Tell" evangelistic opportunities
- To be strategic in creating and implementing "Come and See" evangelistic opportunities
- To engage and follow up with new women in a winsome way on and off the church campus
- To become fluent in one's personal testimony and able to utilize it for gospel declaration in meeting with women one on one, in small groups, or in large groups
- To be able to winsomely share the gospel in a variety of contexts
- To be able to do apologetics when the situation calls for it

• Discipleship/ Teaching

- To be able to individually disciple young women on a regular basis
- To gather and connect women to the women's Foundry discipleship program in the church
- To be able to teach small groups

• Church Wide Involvement

- To encourage and facilitate the participation of young women in the worship services of FPC
- To encourage women to attend the Inquirer's Class and consider joining the church
- To seek ways to connect women to the generations of the church
- To encourage women to volunteer in a variety of ways in the life of the church

• Gathering

- To actively gather women to the events and programs of the young pros ministry (Sunday school, Small groups, one on one discipleship, parties, retreats, etc)
- To be willing to meet one on one, speak at events, text, email, call, use social media, do anything it takes to gather women to the gospel and the church

• To gather volunteers from within the church to serve in a variety of ways in young pros (mentors, teachers, hosts, cooks, etc)
