## Luke 1:1-4

<sup>1</sup> Many have undertaken to draw up an account of the things that have been fulfilled among us, <sup>2</sup> just as they were handed down to us by those who from the first were eyewitnesses and servants of the word. <sup>3</sup> With this in mind, since I myself have carefully investigated everything from the beginning, I too decided to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, <sup>4</sup> so that you may know the certainty of the things you have been taught.

## Questions

- 1. What does Luke say about how he wrote the gospel?
- 2. Consider 2 Tim. 3:16-17 and 2 Pet. 1:20-21. What do they say about the role of the Holy Spirit as Luke went about his work of composing this gospel?
- 3. Think of common questions people have about the Bible and how these verses may speak to those questions.
- 4. In your own journey, what have been struggles you have had with scripture, and what has been unhelpful and helpful to you?
- 5. Focus on verse 4, why does Luke write the gospel?
  - 1. How can certainty about the Bible become self-righteous and self-justifying?
  - 2. How can certainty about the Bible be humble and full of grace and love? Reflect upon verse 2 and how it relates to humility.
- 6. Who is the Bible really about? Why does that matter for us as we engage the Bible?
