Day 1

Grab some friends and play Hide-and-Seek!

Rules:

- 1. Pick a home base. The Seeker counts to 25 while others hide.
- 2. The Seeker gets 1 minute to find someone.
- 3. If the Seeker finds someone, that person is the next Seeker.
- 4.If no one is found, the hiders run to base.
- 5. If the Seeker tags someone before they reach base, that person is the next Seeker.

The base is a safe place-once you get there, you can't be tagged! God is like that too. He is our safe place. We can trust Him to help us and take care of us because He loves us.

As you play again, thank God for being your safe place!

Day 2

Read Psalm 145:17

Now, grab your toothbrush and your hairbrush. What are these two things used for? Yep. Hair and teeth. What if you switched them? Would you use your toothbrush to brush your hair or your hairbrush to brush your teeth? Why not?

The verse you read says God is right in everything He does. Just like a toothbrush is just right for brushing your teeth and a hairbrush is just right for brushing your hair. God is right in EVERYTHING He does.

As you use these two brushes for their specific purposes this week, thank God for being a God you can trust because He is always right and faithful.

<u>Day 3</u>

Find something that you can hide in your house that will be the "treasure." After you hide the treasure, create a map that correctly leads someone to it. Make your map accurate yet easy to follow! Have fun!

This week continue to think about how God's plan is always better than ours. Pray and ask God to show you the best plan.

Dear God, I know that you know all of the plans I have for my life. Plans to help me grow, learn, and be my best. God, I pray that I can always follow Your plan even when I want to only follow my own. I want to learn to trust you always. I love you, Amen.

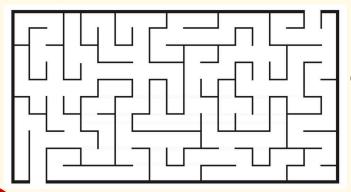
Day 4
