BE AN OVERCOMER

IESUS KNEW OUR NEED TO OVERCOME

Not long before Jesus was going to be crucified, He had a very strong message of encouragement for His disciples. You could sum up Jesus' challenge with one word: overcome. Jesus knew that His time with the disciples was drawing to an end and that they would struggle with many doubts, fears, and difficulties. After all, their mentor was about to be publicly humiliated and killed as a criminal. He knew their journey was just beginning, and that it would take a miracle to keep them on task. And what was the disciples' task? To teach the world about who Jesus really was, the Savior of the world. A miracle is just what they got. Jesus not only was crucified in front of them, He came back to life after being dead for three days.

TROUBLES WILL COME

Imagine being one of the disciples who was eating breakfast with the <u>risen</u> Savior on the shoreline after fishing all night. Do you think you would stare in disbelief, or have to pinch yourself to make sure that you weren't hallucinating? I'm sure the words that Jesus used just days before that meal suddenly felt real to the disciples. In John 16:33 Jesus said to the disciples, "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." I'm sure when these words were initially uttered to the disciples, it must have been frightening or confusing. They signed up to be disciples, not suffer the inconvenience and pain of trouble. But as they sat there eating, looking at the nail-scarred hands that passed out the food, overcoming the world must have felt very attainable. If the trouble of death couldn't keep Jesus down, then what kind of trouble would now keep them from their purpose in life?

WE SHALL OVERCOME

The disciple John clearly grasped onto this idea, and he faithfully lived his life in a way to encourage all of Jesus' followers to do the same. He wrote in 1 John 5:4-5, "everyone born of God overcomes the world. This is the victory that has overcome the world, even our faith. Who is it that overcomes the world? Only the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God." John experienced many troubles as he faithfully followed Jesus, but he never forgot that this world's challenges could be overcome through His Savior and Friend. I'm thankful that John recorded these words of encouragement for us. I have no idea what 2025 threw at you. I'm not sure if troubles, or death, or hardship lurked around you this past year. But what I am confident in is this: we shall overcome if we stay faithful to Jesus. This is a promise that was sealed when Jesus came walking, fully alive, out of a tomb that held His once dead body. Walk faithfully in confidence with Jesus, and you will overcome the troubles of this world!


