For through the Word and the sacraments as through instruments the Holy Spirit is given..." (Kolb/Wengert, 41). Remember to pray that the Lord send laborers into His harvest; pray that God's people would listen for and heed God's Word spoken by His called and ordained messengers; and as Jarrod's preparation continues, pray for him and for his whole family!

Pastor Kottlowski will continue his thorough study of Romans, following the Apostle Paul on a course through the context of the doctrine of justification and its joyous outflow in the life of the Christian.
