

The Word...Dwelt Among Us

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, The Lord's peace be with you! The Season of Advent is here again, counting back four Sundays from Christmas Day. You've seen Halloween decorations change toward Christmas in the stores, maybe with a short Thanksgiving in between. You'll notice a seasonal shift in the Church too. With Advent begins what the Church calls "the time of Christ," or "festival time," which runs through the Day of Pentecost. Festival time, which encompasses the two great feasts of Christmas and Easter, with two times of preparation and fasting that precede the feasting.

Though less commonly known, Advent is like Lent—a fast in the Church, in which we practice disci-

plines that prepare our souls for the celebration of the Christmas feast. We mourn over our sins, and we look to the coming of Christ at Christmas and at the last day. We give up bad habits and we stop caving to evil desires, while we feed all that is godly—learning to pray and study the Scriptures more earnestly. Even the Liturgy changes in order to mark the season—for nearly all of festival time, we'll use Divine Service Setting Three. In Advent and Lent, though, the Church refrains from singing the Gloria. It's a time to keep the spiritual disciplines and to prepare for the full-voiced rejoicing of Christmas and Epiphany.

You may notice too that there's not a Gospel Procession during the time of Advent or Lent. The Gospel Procession is a way that the Church celebrates the presence of Christ among us, especially in the Holy Gospels. But in Advent we look forward to Christmas when the Word becomes flesh and comes to live in the midst of His people. Then at Christmas, our reflection on our own sin and brokenness gives way once more to a golden feast. We'll revel in the Gospel Procession again and celebrate the Lord Who strides right into the midst of a messy congregation, and hundreds of broken lives, and speaks Himself into our ears and souls for our forgiveness and healing and life. God be with you all!

John 1:6-14

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light. The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him. He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him. But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.

Update from Vicar Jarrod Thomas

Grace and peace to you from our Lord Jesus Christ, This month at ULC has continued to be filled with wonderful opportunities to teach and work with the congregation here in Minneapolis. I have continued to preach every other Sunday, and I recently finished planning an Advent midweek preaching series here, where Pastor Kind and I will be preaching through sections of Zechariah each week. It was great fun to try and put together readings with Psalms and hymns for each week, while constraining myself to the few weeks we have of Advent. I will be working on a similar project for Lenten midweek services soon.



I have also started teaching Sunday morning Bible study, where we are slowly making our way through Titus. That has been a great joy to study and prepare for, as well as actually teaching it. In the first couple weeks of teaching on it, we have made it through the first three and a half verses, which have been fantastic to wrestle with and discuss. It is a delight to see the joy everyone has in studying and analysing God's Word!

I have continued teaching Greek and our Confessions group, as well as assisting with our homeschool co-op. I have been in talks with the co-op to teach the mothers and any children old enough Latin in the Spring or Summer, as many of them are very interested in classical education. This will be a huge blessing for me as well, as it will help me better learn that ancient language which so many of our forefathers in the faith wrote in.

We have had a lot of events the last few weeks. At the end of October, we had our Halloween party, which was a blast! The next week, we had a card-writing event, where we wrote cards to all of the people on our prayer list up here. Later this week, as I'm writing this, we are taking a trip to the Minneapolis Institute of Art to have a relaxing evening appreciating the artwork. Outside of these more regularly scheduled church events, we also have hosted a concert here, featuring English Renaissance era music, which was beautiful. The next day, I went with a few congregants to an organ concert nearby, which was fantastic.



I'll be back home for Thanksgiving week since we don't have any events that week. I'm looking forward to seeing everyone then!
