Staying Safe Online: Protecting Yourself from Phishing Scams

In today's digital world, staying connected through email, social media, and online platforms is part of our daily lives. However, with these conveniences come risks, particularly from cybercriminals who use deceptive tactics like *phishing scams* to exploit trust and steal personal information. As we strive to be good stewards of our resources and protect our community, let's take a moment to learn about phishing and how to stay safe.

What is Phishing?

Phishing is a type of cyberattack where scammers pretend to be trustworthy individuals or organizations to trick you into sharing sensitive information, such as passwords, bank details, or Social Security numbers. These scams often arrive through:

- Emails that appear to come from a legitimate source, like a bank, a charity, or even someone you know.
- Text messages (smishing) that urge you to click a link or provide information immediately.
- **Phone calls** (vishing) where the caller impersonates a trusted authority, like a government official or tech support.

Phishing messages often create a sense of urgency, pressuring you to act quickly without thinking. For example, an email might claim your account is compromised and demand you "verify" your login details by clicking a link.

How to Spot a Phishing Scam

Here are key signs to watch for:

- 1. **Suspicious Sender Details**: Check the sender's email address closely. A legitimate organization like "example@church.org" might be mimicked as "example@churchh.org" or come from a free email service like Gmail.
- 2. **Urgent or Threatening Language**: Messages that warn of account suspension, fines, or missed opportunities unless you act immediately are often scams.
- 3. **Unexpected Links or Attachments**: Hover over (but don't click!) links to see the true URL. Avoid opening attachments from unknown or unexpected sources.
- 4. **Poor Grammar or Spelling**: Many phishing attempts contain typos or awkward phrasing, unlike professional communications.
- 5. **Requests for Sensitive Information**: Legitimate organizations rarely ask for passwords or financial details via email or text.

Steps to Protect Yourself

- 1. **Pause and Verify**: If a message feels urgent, take a moment to verify its legitimacy. Contact the organization directly using a phone number or website you know is real—not the contact info in the suspicious message.
- 2. **Use Strong, Unique Passwords**: Create complex passwords and avoid reusing them across accounts. Consider a password manager to keep track securely.
- 3. Enable Two-Factor Authentication (2FA): Add an extra layer of security to your email and other accounts by requiring a second form of verification, like a code sent to your phone.

Grab your coffee (in a reusable cup of course) and head into the FLC for *The Who, What, When, Where, Why of It All.* Join us as we explore all that it means that Jesus descends from heaven to be with us in the Divine Liturgy, why we do what we do, say what we say, sing what we sing, and even dress how we dress! We'll see how it all engages us with Christ, pointing forward to Him or backward to Him or pointing straight at Him in the here-and-now.

- 4. **Be Cautious with Links**: Avoid clicking links in unsolicited messages. Type the organization's official website into your browser instead.
- 5. **Report Suspicious Messages**: If you receive a questionable email or text, report it to your email provider or forward it to the Federal Trade Commission at spam@uce.gov. If it targets our church, let our leadership know.



Vicar Jarrod Thomas Keeping Busy

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ. I have now been up in the Twin Cities for about two months. I have been preaching regularly now, which has been a great joy for me. Teaching and preaching is the chief duty of a Lutheran Pastor, so it has been a blessing to spend so much time working on it. I have also continued teaching Greek and a Book of Concord Study, both of which have been a gift from God for me to work on. Junior Catechesis has been going well, the class is very dedicated and eager to learn. I am soon going to be teaching Sunday morning Bible study as well.

I am still assisting with all the church services here. I'm also involved with the church's homeschool group, and I am leading Matins on Thursday mornings as well. I was put in charge of planning our social events this school year, so we had a fire out on the patio a couple weeks ago and we are watching the Luther movie this week to celebrate the Reformation. We have continued to have our monthly Patristic reading group and our monthly theology dinners.

We also had our Fall retreat at the beginning of October, with the speaker, Dr. Nathan Greeley, talking about the role of philosophy in understanding the attributes of God and addressing the problem of evil. It was a good time, and Dr. Greeley was a delight to have around.

I have been working through Luther's *Lectures on Genesis*, which have been incredibly insightful and edifying to read. Martin Chemnitz' *Examination of the Council of Trent* has also been very helpful to read, though I still have a large chunk of it to get through. Reading through the sermons of men like Johann Gerhard, Bede, Augustine, and especially Luther has been a huge blessing for my own preaching, as those preachers were amazing at keeping their sermons in line with the text





