Note from Vicar Jarrod Thomas

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ! I have now been at my vicarage site in Minneapolis for a few weeks, and it has been far better than I ever could have imagined. Pastor Kind, my supervisor, is fantastic, and the congregation has been a delight to get to know and spend time with. I moved in the last weekend of August, was installed the first weekend of September, the church had its 100 year anniversary celebrations the second weekend, and I preached the third weekend, so it has been a very busy few weeks.

I have been tasked with preaching more or less every other Sunday, and I will eventually be leading the Sunday morning and Wednesday evening Bible Studies as well.

I have been tasked with teaching the junior catechesis class once a week, as well as assisting a home-school co-op that meets every other week here. I also assist with a Wednesday Evening Prayer service, and I lead an early Matins service on Thursday mornings. About every other week, we have a social outing, such as a board game night or bowling. The church also has a monthly Patristic Reading group where we are going through an early church work, and a monthly theological discussion table at one of the local restaurants.

October Bible Studies at St. Paul

BASIC Bible Study

Thursdays, October 9, October 23 and October 30 at 10:00am. Led by Pastor Kottlowski, they will continue the study of Romans, following the Apostle Paul on a course through the context of the doctrine of justification and its joyous outflow in the life of the Christian.

Homebuilders

Sunday, October 5 at 4:00pm. *The Sanctuary Is Our Home*. This year Homebuilders (a group for those interested in following Jesus as a household) will delve into the Sacrament of the Altar as the center of life for the Christian family. From the altar where the Lord visits His people extend the spokes of Christian living: mercy, witness, and life together as a household held in Christ. We'll ponder the mysteries of God's gift in the Body and Blood of Christ, and learn together how we can live more fully in Jesus as we step from the altar toward all the places the Jesus sends His people. They'll meet the first Sunday of each month.

Midweek Bible Studies

Wednesdays from 6:00pm-7:00pm. Adults meet in the Sanctuary with Pastor Newton. Senior youth are in the youth room and junior youth meet with Laura Nelson in the youth room by the Fellowship Hall. Worship follows at 7:00pm.

Monday Night Women's Bible Study

Mondays at 6:30pm in the FLC. Led by Sarah Newton, they are walking together through Paul's letter to the Colossians. Join them as they take the time and soak in the views from this short but powerful epistle. All you need is your Bible.

Sunday Morning Adult Bible Study

Sundays at 9:30am in the FLC. Grab your coffee (in a reusable cup of course) and head into the FLC for *The Who, What, When, Where, Why of It All*. Join us as we explore all that it means that Jesus descends from heaven to be with us in the Divine Liturgy, why we do what we do, say what we say, sing what we sing, and even dress how we dress! We'll explore the Liturgy as we experience it on Sunday mornings, we'll dig into Holy Scripture especially in Leviticus and Hebrews, we'll hear from the Confessions and from other work of Martin Luther, and we'll explore the new Companion to the Services from CPH and other resources on what happens in worship. We'll see how it all engages us with Christ, pointing forward to Him or backward to Him or pointing straight at Him in the here-and-now.

Sunday Morning Youth Bible Study

Sundays at 9:30am. Join Dave Brunelle and Laura Nelson on an engaging journey through God's Word as we look into the lectionary and see how it points us to Jesus and our identity in Him. Each Sunday from 9:30-10:30am, Junior youth gather with Dave and Senior youth with Laura for conversational Bible study. Together we'll explore Christ's teachings and rejoice in the many wonders of God's grace!

Thursday Morning Ladies Bible Study

Thursday, October 2 and Thursday, October 16 at 10:00am. Led by Pastor Kottlowski. They are using a devotional book entitled *Unfailing: God's Assurance for Times of Change* by Rev Christopher M. Kennedy. Pastor Kennedy uses examples from the prophet Samuel's life to illustrate and teach God's promises to be with us during life's many changes.

Along with these things, Pastor Kind asked me what I would like to teach, so I am also teaching a weekly introductory Greek class and a biweekly Confessions Study Group. Both have been going very well so far. Teaching Greek is helping my own Greek, which is in turn going to help my preaching and teaching, so that has been a blessing for my own studies. The Confessions Study Group has also been a fantastic opportunity to work through the Book of Concord with others, and to see how others see the topics contained in it showing up in their contexts and lives.

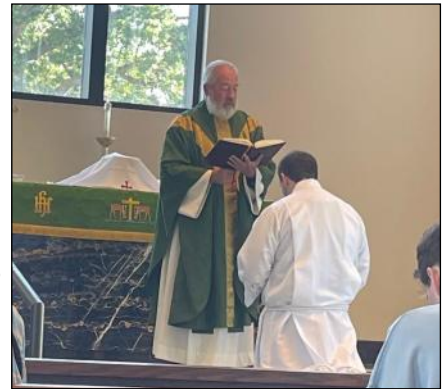
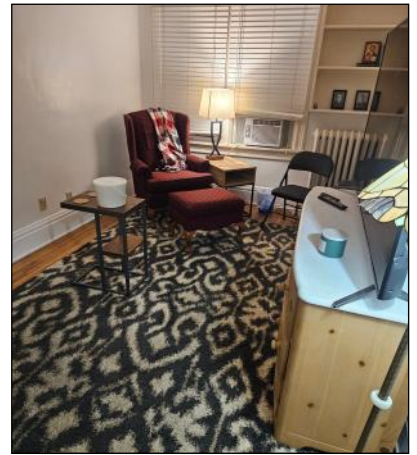
On top of these regular teaching and service opportunities, Pastor Kind is also making sure he and I dedicate time to my own formation and studies. We pray and have a meeting just about daily. We are also working through a book *Gregory the Great* (6th-7th century bishop/theologian), *Moral Reflections on the Book of Job*, which has been incredibly edifying and beneficial to read. Outside of our studies together, I am also working on Latin and reading Martin Luther and Martin Chemnitz, as they are the best and second best theologians since the Apostles.

All in all, it has been a very busy few weeks, though filled with countless blessings. I am looking forward to the rest of the year up here, as it has been fantastic for me. This may include: overgeneralizing – after one thing goes wrong, thinking, “Things NEVER go right for me;” exaggerated responsibility for others – “Why aren’t you happy? It must be because of something I did or didn’t do;” and negative self-labeling – “I didn’t get up in time to exercise today – I’m lazy and a failure.” Left unchallenged, distorted messages only deepen the despair. Depression is not a lack of faith or a character flaw, but a serious illness which when left untreated can destroy a life, a marriage and a family. It is treatable and you can feel better.
