The Lord Bless You and Keep You

The Lord spoke to Moses, saying, "Speak to Aaron and his sons, saying, Thus you shall bless the people of Israel: you shall say to them, 'The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the Lord lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace.' So shall they put my name upon the people of Israel, and I will bless them." Numbers 6:22-27

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

"The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all" (II Corinthians 13:14)! One of the real joys of the Office of the Holy Ministry is that Jesus speaks benediction, blessing, on His people through His pastors. Pastors are called to bless the people of God. That doesn't just refer to the good things God does through His pastors in general, and certainly it doesn't refer to anything that comes from the pastor himself! Pastors, as ambassadors for Christ (II Corinthians 5:20), are God's agents to bless His people.

In the Benediction during the Divine Service (and elsewhere), pastors speak the blessing as heralds of the Lord, just the way God commanded His priests to bless His people in Numbers 6. It's more than communicating information—it's conveying what it says: the blessing of God! That's what God commanded Aaron and his sons (paraphrased): "Bless my people this way: The Lord do good to you and guard you from evil; the Lord light up your darkness and give you gifts; the Lord smile on you and give you peace." It's not "may the Lord bless you..."—that's the language of wishing and hoping. This is far more trustworthy, because God promises He is making the blessing happen there in that moment, so: "The Lord bless you and keep you..."

In Numbers 6, the Lord makes it clear that to bless someone is to put His name on them—God's name brings God's blessing! In the Large Catechism on Holy Baptism, Martin Luther expressed it this way: "Where God's name is, there must also be life and salvation" (LC IV, 27 Kolb/Wengert). In the hymnal, the last words go like this: "and + give you peace." That's a reminder to make the sign of the holy cross in order to be brought back to the promise of your Baptism, to confess before God and those around you that you are marked with the sign of Christ's cross, and to rejoice that the blessing and name of God are yours through the death of Jesus the Christ. God be with you all!

September Bible Studies Begin

BASIC Bible Study

Begins Thursday, September 25. Led by Pastor Kottlowski, they meet the second, fourth and fifth Thursday of each month and will continue the study of Romans with chapter 10. Pastor Kottlowski continues the study of Romans, following the Apostle Paul on a course through the context of the doctrine of justification and its joyous outflow in the life of the Christian.

Homebuilders (October start)

Begins Sunday, October 5 at 4:00pm. *The Sanctuary Is Our Home*. This year Homebuilders (a group for those interested in following Jesus as a household) will delve into the Sacrament of the Altar as the center of life for the Christian family. 






Senior Youth Sunday Funday
