Chicken Tenders and Christ's Table

Well...a new chicken tenders place has opened in Tupelo! And on the west side too! Huey Magoo's. We ate there for lunch on Sunday and it was pretty good. Staff was very nice. Tenders were good. Magoo sauce is on point. Everything about it was very pleasant. But at the end of the day...it was just chicken tenders.

That's the thing about chicken tenders. You really can't go wrong serving them. Everybody likes them. Kids will eat them. Fried. Grilled. Either is fine. Doesn't really matter if it came from Slim Chicken's or the gas station. They'll be fine to serve. It's just usually not something to write home about. No one leaves from the event and says "We had chicken tenders! Can you believe it?!"

Nah. Nobody really acts that way. It's just chicken tenders.

I fear sometimes we approach communion at the Lord's Table that way.

It's the first Sunday of the month. Time for communion.

No one is UPSET that it's time for communion. It's fine. We always do it the first Sunday. We can check off that we've had it. That works.

But are we in AWE of what it means to come to His table or do we treat it like we do chicken tenders? Like it's "meh" or something.

We're quick to talk about how bland the wafer can be. Or how we wish we had that OTHER bread we used to serve. I've done it myself.

But we need to get back to the place where we are HUMBLED by the experience and opportunity to partake of the Lord's Supper and to commune with Him at His table. When Jesus holds up the bread and wine and says "This is my body broken for you...this is my blood shed for you"...that is nothing to just shrug off. The SON OF GOD gave His life...His very body and blood...for YOU. He died for YOU.

Catholics believe that Holy Communion, or the Eucharist, is the actual body, blood, soul, and divinity of Christ, a belief known as transubstantiation where the elements of bread and wine actually BECOME the body and blood of Christ. They believe that once you consume Holy Communion, you are actually incorporated into Christ and are united and bonded with Him and the Church. And while we as Methodists don't QUITE believe that way, we do believe in the symbolism it represents and it may behoove us to get to a place where Communion Sunday is not just a ritual we do or a task to check off on the first Sunday of every month. It is an opportunity to recognize the lengths to which Jesus went to save our souls from an eternity spent in Hell and to offer us a seat at His heavenly table. It is a chance to seek forgiveness for ourselves and to offer that same forgiveness to others. It is a time to FEAST on His grace, mercy, and love and to be FILLED with His Holy Spirit!

So friends...this is not just a wafer or stale piece of bread and a sip of juice. It is a meal worthy to tell everyone we meet about! Go and tell others about what God has prepared! Invite them to the table! This is dinner with the KING.

It's not just chicken tenders.






