A few insisted they must continue, for saving lives was their true purpose.

They were then told to start their own station to continue the rescue work.

So they did.

But as the years passed, the new station repeated the same story. It became more of a social club than a rescue outpost.

Another life-saving station was found....

and then another.

But the cycle just repeated.




