The Times They Are A-Changin'

Have you ever thought about how much culture and tradition dictates our schedules?

Christians have been worshipping together as a church on Sunday or "the first day of the week" for 2000 years (see Acts 20:7 and 1 Corinthians 16:2). Evidently early Christians who were raised Jewish still wanted to go to synagogue on Saturday with their families. But in hopes of gathering with a group of people who shared in their belief that Jesus was the Messiah, they had to pick another time for worship and studying the scriptures with one another.

Sunday was the obvious choice. After all, it was the day the Lord had risen and devoting their worship to him on "the first day of the week" seemed fitting. The only problem was that in that culture Sunday was a workday (like our Mondays today). That meant early church gatherings would not begin until evening, allowing for people to get off from work.

Imagine going to work all day, then to church where you would eat a meal together, followed by listening to someone like Paul teach the scriptures for hours. You might fall asleep too like that young man named Eutychus in Acts 20.

In 1 Corinthians 11, we can reason that meeting on Sunday evenings came with other challenges that Paul had to correct. The meal or "Lord's Supper" mentioned earlier became something that not everyone got to enjoy. For example, church members with more money and better hours could arrive to the meal at church sooner than those who had to work longer. But instead of waiting on them to arrive or practicing portion control, the haves dug in leaving the have-nots with empty plates. This is why Paul chides them exclaiming, "One person is hungry while another gets drunk!" (1 Corinthians 11:21)

Times have changed, but the need to accommodate others so they can experience church and God's grace has not. This is ultimately why you will see some slight changes in Wednesday scheduling starting in September.

When I began to ask younger adults within our church why they were not attending Auxano classes like I'd hoped for, the most common answer was, "We have to work until 5 pm." Of course, South Main's Wednesday dinner has traditionally begun at that time. Therefore, we are pushing Wednesday night meals to 5:30 pm as a slight accommodation, with multiple Auxano opportunities to follow at 6:30 on that evening or on other nights of the week.

The deeper we get into the fall, the sooner the sun will set. Knowing this later adjustment may discourage some who have trouble driving at night from attending, we will also offer a Wednesday lunch option. Those with longer lunch breaks, or who may prefer a midday Bible study can come to what we're calling Twice Fed on Wednesdays starting in September from 12-1 pm. Trish Gibb and I will be teaching through Paul's letter to the Galatians as you enjoy lunch. If you happen to miss it, we will repeat this teaching once again following dinner at 6:30.

Be on the lookout for plenty of other Auxano opportunities offered at a variety of times throughout the week. These will be featured in our September-December booklet for 2025. I know the impossibilities of accommodating everyone's schedule. But if we are going to continue engaging and equipping others to experience and share God's transforming love, we want to extend occasions and opportunities where that's accessible.
