- Family Activity: Turn off devices during dinner and share one way each person can spend time with God this week.

Sermon Summary

Gods Greatest Summer

This sermon powerfully reminded us that God's greatest joy is a thriving relationship with His people. From the beginning, His plan was to remove every barrier—cultural, spiritual, and physical—that separated us from Him. Through Christ's sacrifice, we no longer live as strangers or outsiders, but as beloved sons and daughters with full access to God's presence.

The message challenged us to grow up in our faith—moving from spiritual infancy to maturity. It's not about earning God's love or performing religious duties, but about spending real time with our Father, knowing His voice, and responding with bold faith. Just as a good parent longs to walk with their children through every season, so God desires an ongoing, daily, and deepening connection with us.

Our boldness in prayer, our clarity in hearing God's voice, and our transformation in daily life all flow from this relationship. This is God's "greatest summer"—you, His child, living fully in His love and purpose.
