Prepare to Die Well

"I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die. Do you believe this?" John 11:25

As you read the title of this article you may have thought to yourself, "Gosh, Pastor Michael, this sounds a bit dark and depressing!" Ok, I can understand your concern, but please keep reading.

Have you ever noticed how people in general are always preparing for something? Whether it's our work, our relationships, or our schedules. Yet with all the things we spend our time preparing for, I am going to assume that for most people preparing to die is probably not on that list.

The reality is this, death is something that is on everyone's appointment calendar, but talking about it seems odd and taboo. Here's why: we convince ourselves that we have a long time to live, and as long as we are healthy, we really believe that we will live forever in this body.

Consider what we often forget. If the God who is revealed in the Bible is revealing truth to us, (and I believe He is) then this life is a dress rehearsal for eternity. The Bible seeks to drive us to "death awareness" and protect ourselves from deception. We need a teacher to sober us up, and the only teacher who can rescue us from ourselves is God. In Psalm 90:12 we read, "So teach us to number our days that we might get a heart of wisdom." Compared to eternity, life is short. We need to value the moments and days God gives us. In doing so, our hearts become wise.

On September 22nd, my dad lived his last day on this earth. In the days before his death, we spent a lot of time in the hospital talking about the things that mattered most. In one of our many conversations, I felt the Holy Spirit prompt me to make sure my dad would "die well" by making sure that Jesus was His

Savior and Lord. I left the hospital that night unsure of how many days my dad had left, but what I was certain of is that my dad was prepared to someday die well.

The words Jesus said in John 11:25 were spoken in a moment when those listening were confronted with the death of a loved one. And consider this, Jesus chose not to avoid the ultimate reality that none of us can avoid. Jesus in His death on a cross, would redeem death for the new purpose of bringing life in a way never experienced! Let's remember that death was never intended for this world.

In the Garden, Adam and Eve were tricked by the promise that they could be "like God." What could be more life-giving than being God himself? But it was all a sham, with deadly consequences. They ate, sin entered the world, and now we must pay the ultimate wage of sin: death. To repair what was broken in the Garden, Jesus Christ freely sacrificed his own life to put sin to death. Through his death and resurrection, life was freely given to those who believe.

The following is a portion of a letter written by John Newton to Mrs. Talbot on October 28th, 1777. Her fear was that her husband may have rejected God and suffered terribly prior to his death. Newton writes these beautiful words of assurance:

"The Lord usually reserves dying strength for a dying hour! You have nothing to fear from death; for Jesus, by dying, has disarmed it of its sting, has perfumed the grave, and opened the gates of glory for his believing people! Satan, so far as he is permitted, will assault our peace—but he is a vanguished enemy. Our Lord holds him with a chain and sets him bounds which he cannot pass."

Death is a defeated enemy, because of Jesus and His resurrection! Trust in Jesus and prepare to die well!
