

We Are the Church

"And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." Acts 2:42

"And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." Matthew 16:18

Ask ten random people what image or phrase comes to mind when they hear the word "church", and you will probably get a variety of responses.

- "A place where Christians gather to worship God."
- "Somewhere you go hear a preacher and sing songs."
- "Well, I don't go to church, but my grandma is pretty 'religious', and she loves her church."

As we prepare to end the summer months, I'm excited to begin a new teaching series titled "We Are the Church" beginning September 7! In the weeks that follow, we will seek to better understand this important question: "What is the church?"

Let me take a moment and introduce you to a big theological word: ecclesiology. This word is used to describe the study of the church. The word itself comes from the Greek words meaning "assembly" and "word." By putting the two together we have the meaning "the study of the church." Some important questions in ecclesiology include: What is the church? What is the purpose of the church? What is the importance of The Lord's Supper/Communion?

The Scripture in Matthew's gospel reminds us why the church exists in the first place. The word *church* first appears in Matthew 16:18 in a conversation that Jesus had with the apostle Peter. In this moment, Jesus reveals that He is the one who will establish His church and that even the gates of hell won't be able to defeat it. That truth about Jesus has provided the foundation of the church that has flourished for over two thousand years!

In the book of Acts, not long after the Holy Spirit was poured out at Pentecost, we read of the believers gathering in Acts 2:42. These four practices- teaching, fellowship, the breaking of bread, and prayer - provide us insight into the early practices of Christianity and the origin of the church. We would do well to consider these normative for the church today.

As we gain a better understanding of ecclesiology, we will also look at the church that is Journey. We will focus on our vision and mission as the church. We will spend time finding ways to equip believers to live our faith in a culture that is becoming increasingly secular. We will also wrestle with current cultural issues that seek to label the church as "hateful or "out of touch."

I thank God for His church that we call Journey! I'm looking forward to learning together this fall as we allow the Word of God to remind us that "We Are the Church."

Missionary Focus: Kyle and Carrie Eipperle

Kyle Eipperle and his family moved to Ohio, IL after serving 17 years in Ukraine with SEND International, translating Christian material into Russian and Ukrainian. Since 2019, Kyle has been working with Operation World (OW),

involved in research concerning unreached people groups.

An unreached people is a people group among which there is no indigenous community of



believing Christians with adequate numbers and resources to evangelize this people group without outside assistance (Joshua Project).

Less than 2% of the people identify as Evangelical Christians.

Kyle pursues research and translation for the Operation World prayer book. The prayer book is widely regarded as the definitive volume of prayer information about the nations of the world. Kyle serves as a research associate to develop and update Russian materials to the Russian and Ukrainian language speaking world.

The history of missions is the history of answered prayer, according to a recent update from Kyle. He states, "Ten years ago I began piecing together a prayer guide featuring the people groups of the North Caucasus region of south Russia. Since the prayer guide's release, countless requests have been prayed for these unreached groups.

"The good news is that we now need to rewrite twelve different prayer points, because God has answered those prayers. Such news reassures us that we labor not in vain. God has clearly and amazingly answered prayers."

- The OW staff is composing first drafts of countries for the next edition of Operation World. This is an exciting new phase, although, since a lot of countries are out there and some are constantly changing, this phase will take some time.
- Pray for the OW team; though they are few, pray they can accomplish much. Pray that God will supply all their needs.
- While writing first drafts of the 8th edition of Operation World, there are several new and high-tech methods being used. Pray that each member of the team can learn new things and that these new methods will serve them well.
- Personally, there have been several unexpected financial expenses lately. God is the provider. Please pray concerning the Eipperle's unexpected needs.

"HELP THE CHURCH" DAY - October 25


