Call to Worship: Psalm 9:1-11

L - I will give thanks to the Lord with my whole heart; I will recount all of your wonderful deeds.

C - I will be glad and exult in you; I will sing praise to your name, O Most High.

L - When my enemies turn back, they stumble and perish before your presence.

C - For you have maintained my just cause; you have sat on the throne, giving righteous judgment.

L - You have rebuked the nations; you have made the wicked perish;

C - you have blotted out their name forever and ever.

L - The enemy came to an end in everlasting ruins; their cities you rooted out;

C - the very memory of them has perished.

L - But the Lord sits enthroned forever; he has established his throne for justice,

C - and he judges the world with righteousness; he judges the peoples with uprightness.

L - The Lord is a stronghold for the oppressed, a stronghold in times of trouble.

C - And those who know your name put their trust in you, for you, O Lord, have not forsaken those who seek you.

L - Sing praises to the Lord, who sits enthroned in Zion! Tell among the peoples his deeds!
