Title: "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in paradise."

Text: Luke 23:39-43 Date: February 26, 2023

Introduction: The story of the dying thief on the cross has much to teach us, not only about deathbed conversions but about any conversion. However, before examining that, let's consider the conversation of the thieves. The Lord and the two other criminals had a conversation. The first criminal "hurled insults at him" (v39). He's hanging on the cross receiving his own death sentence and, with his final breath, he decides to mock the Lord along with the crowd. "Aren't you the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" Some people go all the way to their condemnation being ignorant and unrepentant.

The second criminal has much better sense. He rebukes the first.

But the other criminal rebuked him. "Don't you fear God," he said, "since you are under the same sentence? We are punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man has done nothing wrong."

Then, showing how much sense this man has, he adds, "Jesus remember me when you come into your kingdom." This man in the last hours of his life came to believe that Jesus was, indeed, the Christ, the Son of the living God. He came to believe that Jesus really did have a kingdom, one that he could possibly enter. He saw his sin and admitted his wrong. He did the only thing he could do—the only thing he needed to do: plead with Christ for forgiveness and mercy. Aside from Jesus, this thief is the only humble man in the entire scene! He's humble enough to admit his sin and humble enough to turn to Jesus for forgiveness. (*Christ Centered Exposition Exalting Jesus in Luke*, Thabiti Anyabwile, p 346-347)

The Lord speaks only one line in the entire conversation. "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in paradise" (v43). What do we need to learn from the dying thief on the cross about conversion?
