Title: "Woman, here is your son,..." "Here is your mother"

Text: John 19:25-27 Date: March 5, 2023

Introduction: We once again stand at Calvary. We see our Christ on the cross. He has asked for forgiveness for others (Luk3 23:34). He has granted forgiveness to one who repented (Luke 23:43). Time passes, and the suffering and agony increase. The heat of the day is intense. The pain of the words is unbearable. The crowd is still jeering and deriding. Most of his followers have forsaken Him and fled. However, there are hundreds near the cross. We, assuredly, can divide most of these individuals into three groups. First, some were there out of delight. There was a high degree of enjoyment and pleasure from the religious leaders and others who hated Him. Second, some where there out of duty. The Roman soldiers had a job to do. They were commanded to carry out this act of crucifixion. Third, some where there out of devotion. "Near the cross of Jesus stood his mother, his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene... and the disciple who he loved" (the Apostle John; John 19:25, 26). They were there because they loved the Lord Jesus.

The first woman mentioned, who was standing near the cross, was Mary, Jesus' mother. She was one of the women of Galilee who came up with Him to Jerusalem. Mary had spent the night of His agony in a sleepless sorrow. She was at the door of Pilate's judgment hall early that morning. Mary followed Him to Calvary. She heard the wailing of the women of Jerusalem and saw the nails driven through His hands and feet. At first, Mary must have stood only on the outskirts of the crowd. As the day wore on, however, the stream of passersby ceased, the soldiers sat down to cast their dice and pass the hours of waiting, and the priests and Scribes fell back into the shade. It was then that Mary, John, and the women drew near until they stood by the cross to hear with wearied hearts His words of recognition and care.

Suspended between earth, which had openly rejected Him, and Heaven, which had seemingly forsaken Him, He remembers His mother, Mary of Nazareth. Hear Him as He says, "Woman, here is your son," and John, "'Here is your mother'" (John 19:26-27). In this scene, there are three people we need to consider. Who are they?

I. The Mother Who Sorrowed

II. The Son Who Suffered

III. The Disciple Who Served
