Title: "I am Thirsty" Text: John 19:28-29 Date: March 19, 2023

Introduction: It is not often appreciated that our Lord Jesus died in terrible, terrible pain. However, He never complained at all about His physical condition through all the hours of suffering. —When they put the crown on His head He didn't say "O, my head!" —When they ripped the beard from His face He didn't say, "O, my face!" —When they scourged Him He didn't say, "O my back!" As the old spiritual has it, through all that they did "He never said a mumblin' word."

Now at last, Jesus cries out in the last moments of His life, "I am thirsty" or "I thirst." Of all the words that Christ spoke from the cross, His cry "I am thirsty" is the shortest. In the Greek New Testament, it is one word of four letters, dipso. It is the only statement in which our Lord referred to His body and His physical suffering. The torture, pain, de-hydration of the body, and high fever would cause Him to thirst. The Psalmist describes this part of the agony of crucifixion. "I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint. My heart has turned to wax; it has melted within me. My mouth is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth; you lay me in the dust of death." (Psalm 22:14-15)

He had prayed for others. "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." He had answered the prayer of a penitent thief. He had considered the needs of His Mother. He had prayed to the Father in the darkness. Now He cries, "I am thirsty." Bystanders had heard the most awful cry to fall from human lips, "My God, my God, why have your forsaken me?" Now they hear one of the most common words of the men, "I am thirsty." They could hear this word any hour, on every hand, in this panicked land. Now, they heard it from the Son of God. He who had scooped out the oceans with His hand, who had drawn the rivers with His fingers, who brought forth water from the rock to quench the thirst of Israel, now cries, "I am thirsty."
